HOME FROM SAN JUAN.

Interesting Experience of Elder William McAllister.

Logan, Cache Co., Feb. 12.—Elder William McAllister is home from a four months' mission in San Juan, and reports a most interesting and profitable experience. He visited almost every ward in the state in the interest of Mutual Improvement work, and was royally treated by the people he visited. He visited among the Navajo Indians occasionally, and was much impressed with the skill they display in the manufacture of blankets, arrowheads, all varieties of pottery, and a large number of curiosities, including a portion of a petrified lizard of large size, petrified shells, samples of Indian handicraft, etc. Elder McAllister visited the settlement of John Roberts, Jr., and states that they can only be reached by a narrow defile along precipitous cliffs, and are arranged in a manner to afford the inhabitants protection from the enemy. The settlement included small portions of Colorado, Arizona and New Mexico, and he jokingly states that he walked around the corner in order to pass through four states at once. He saw at Salt Lake City, and was much impressed with the skill they display in the manufacture of blankets, arrowheads, all varieties of pottery, and a large number of curiosities, including a portion of a petrified lizard of large size, petrified shells, samples of Indian handicraft, etc. Elder McAllister visited the settlement of John Roberts, Jr., and states that they can only be reached by a narrow defile along precipitous cliffs, and are arranged in a manner to afford the inhabitants protection from the enemy.
