Bro. Hancock died at Galland's Grove, Iowa, leaving her with two small children. In the spring of 1851, she crossed the plains, living first in Salt Lake Valley, but in 1864, with her son John Hancock, she settled in Montpelier.—[Com.]

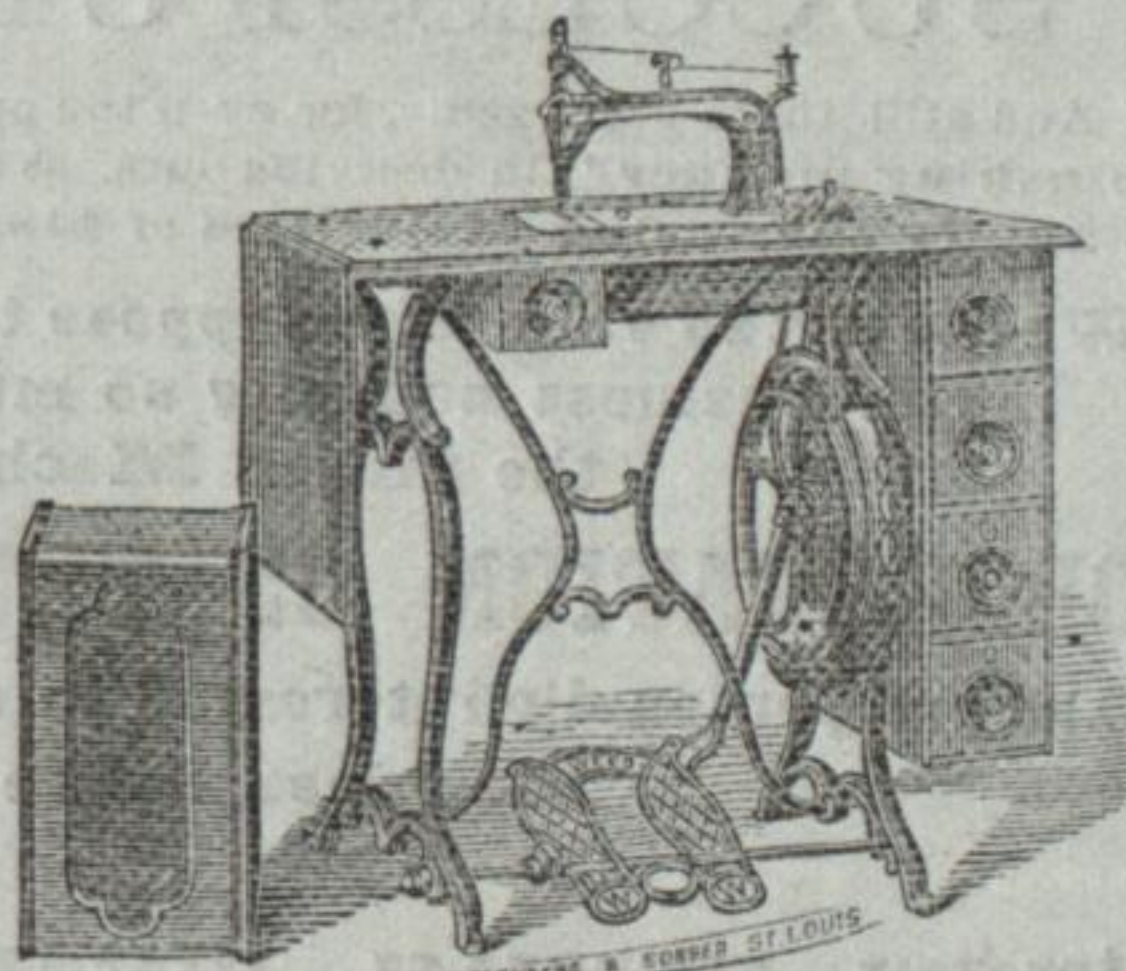

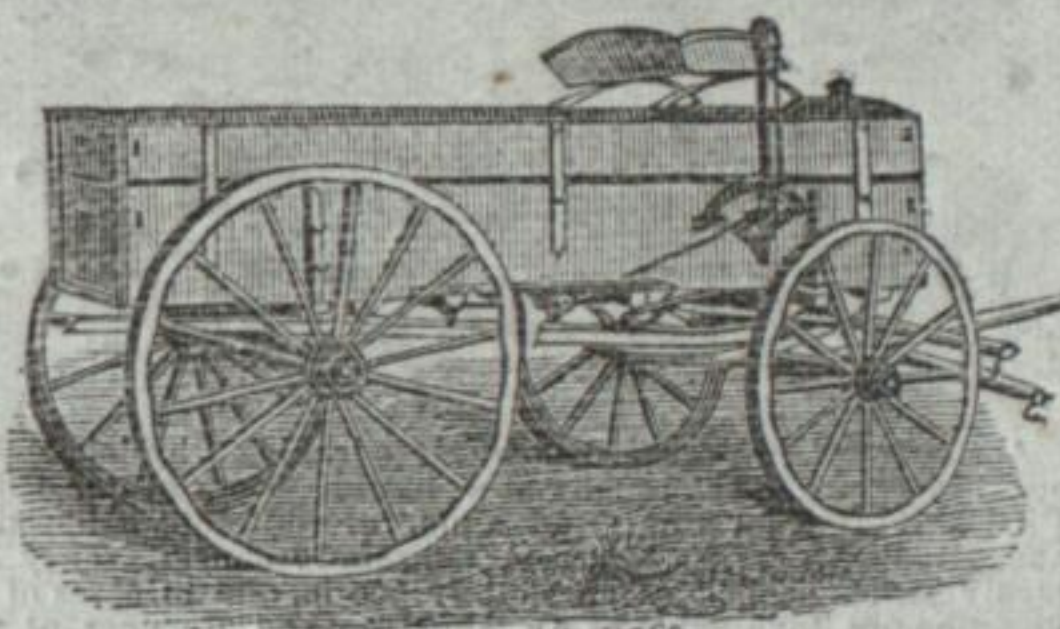
