It seems as if it were only a few days since I was in the midst of this people, for the days, weeks and months that have passed, have gone swiftly, and it seems as though a great deal of the time had not been measured lo me.

I presume this is the experience of many of vou who are now before me and, although many | of you have passed through scenes of trial, yet you have felt to realize your situation in the reformation more than you ever have done before. Feelings have come over you that you have never before experienced since you have been in the Church of J-sus Christ of Latter Day Saints. But, notwithstanding all our past feilings and weaknesses, we have been greatly blessed and prospered, and the hand of the Lord has been over us for good all the day long.
