NEW YORK, April 1.—The Le Boat Amusement company, which will bring out "Noah's Ark" on the 23d of April at Baltimore, and in which Harry Bulger again makes his bow to the public as a star, has secured the services of Sallie Fisher, who has a part equal to Bulger's in interest and claim for popular favor. Miss Fisher left Frank Daniels and the "Tattooed Man" last Wednesday to begin rehearsals in the new piece.
