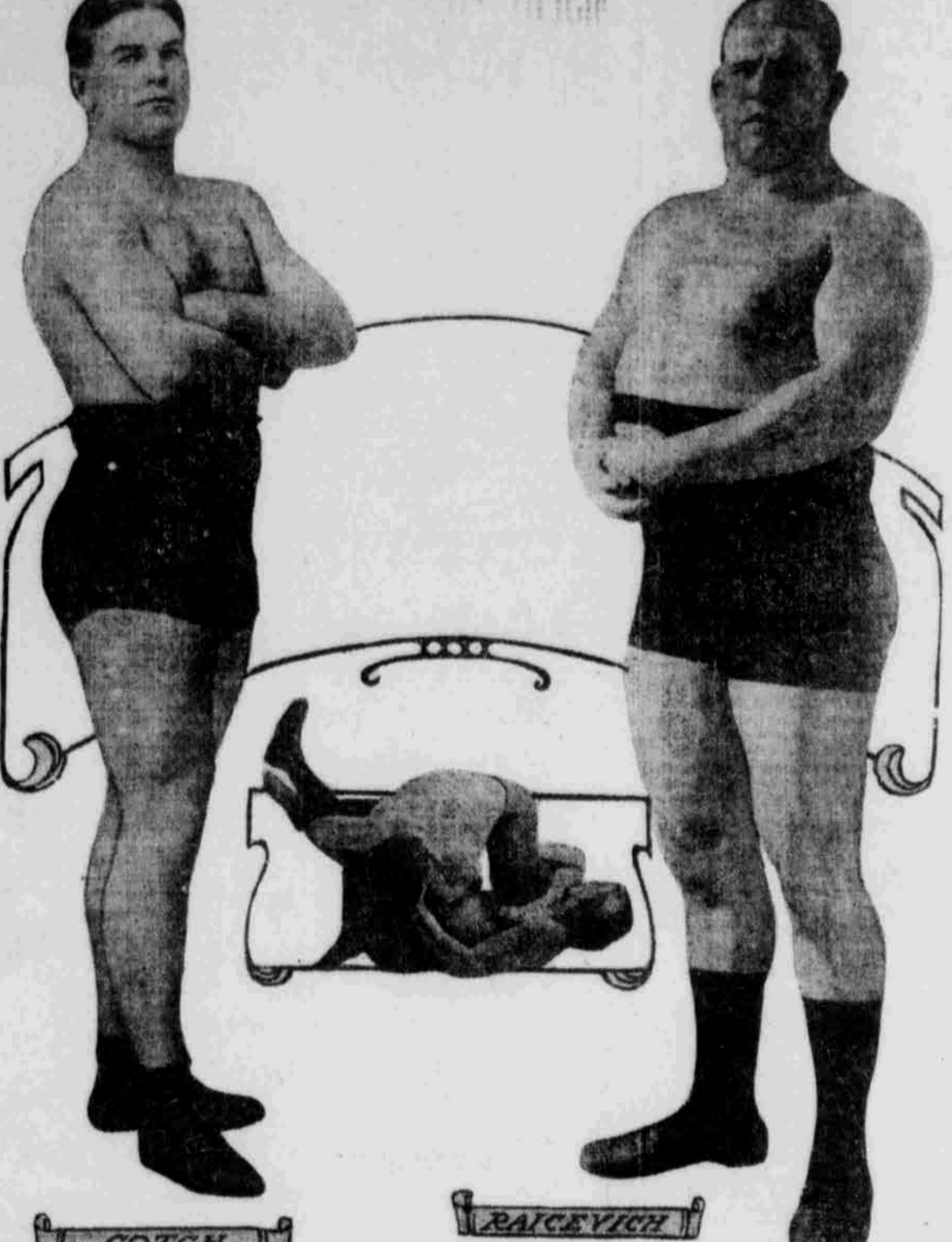
MY ARRANGE GAME.
