was the first speaker. He expressed his pleasure at what had been said during the Conference thus far, and the young people were greatly interested. The speaker had evoked forth the thought that God's work of God has a glorious future before it. It is a hopeful sign to see the young people so interested. Then throwing off their hats in admiration and calling out the shout of righteousness.

Speaking of the thoughts of Professor Peleg, the speaker said that one of the statements of that great man is to the effect that the theory regarding the heavenly bodies, moral or spiritual, and develop into truth. Compare this with the theory of the Latter-day Saints, and it will be seen how that theory plays into insignificance. The sons and daughters of Zion should be trained in these same thoughts, all things that are noble and elevating.

The testimony of one man outside the pale of the Church had been borne to the speaker, that the young people of Zion were the best young men in the movement in the world. The tendency toward perfection must be eternal, and the education of our fellowmen will follow ours. Emulate every good example seen and strive to realize the perfection exemplified in the life of Christ.
