FOURTY-SEVENTH CONGRESS.

SENATE.

WASHINGTON, 8.—Grover called

up the Senate bill to authorize the

Secretary of the Treasury to

examine and report to Congress

the amount of all the claims of

the States of Texas, Oregon and

Nevada, and the Territories of

Washington, Idaho, for money

expended and debts assumed by

said States and Territories in

repelling invasion and

suppressing Indian hostilities.

The bill passed to include the

claims of Nebraska, California and

Colorado, and expenses incurred

on account of Mexican raids.

The Senate resumed the district

appropriation bill.

The committee of amendments

reporting about \$40,000 of un-

paid taxes on the property of the

late Superintendent of the

coast survey, was rejected upon

the usual question of order, upon

the bill being reported from the

committee of the whole. The com-

mittee was sustained in each in-

stance and no further change was

made, and the bill passed.

Hawley reported from the mili-

tary committee a joint resolution

appropriating \$100,000 for much

thereof as may be needed to furnish

food to the people made destitute

by the floods in the State of Missis-

sippi. He said the plagues there

have been paying the field hands in

expectation of being remunerated

by the coming crops, but now the

floods have dissipated these expec-

tations and made necessary this

additional provision. The joint

resolution passed. Adjourned.

HOUSE.

WASHINGTON, 8.—The bill passed

increasing to \$40 per month the

pension of any person who, in the

last war lost an arm, leg, hand or

foot, or received disabilities equal

thereto.

The House went into committee

and resumed consideration of the

general deficiency appropriation bill.

The only discussion was upon the

clause to refund to Missouri the

payments made to officers and pri-

vates in the militia of the State for

services actually performed in the

suppression of the rebellion, which

was finally agreed to. The amount

involved is \$254,584.
