OGDEN.

OGDEN, UTAH. - JULY 27, 1893.
A few hours ago the Ogden Association voted to accept the offer of the Ogden City Council to contribute \$10,000 for the construction of a new bridge over the Weber River at the mouth of the Ogden, or all costs and all expenses.

It is temporarily disposed of by Judge Zane.

The suit of Wm. Garland, vs the Bear Lake and River Irrigation company was continued yesterday morning before Judge Zane and the matter has been temporarily settled. The hearing was on the petition of the plaintiff asking that a receiver be appointed for the Bear River Canal company and its assets. The defendant's attorneys for Mr. Garland gave notice that they had abandoned the idea of asking for a receiver. After considerable discussion on a glowing issue the attorney for the plaintiff asked for an order which was drawn up and approved by the court. In the order the plaintiff is permitted to change his complaint to include the words "judgments herein" as shown by the judgment hereinafter. The court ruled that the defendant was not well taken and therefore overruled it. By consent of the defendant it was ordered that a temporary injunction be issued which would restrain defendants from embezzling, defrauding, or in any way misappropriating the property described in the amended complaint. The defendants were allowed to make water right deeds and contracts for water from the Bear river canal at fair and reasonable prices. The amount of both sale and rentals to be held subject to the order of the court.

This leaves very important suit, involving in all more than \$100,000, in much the same condition as it was after the first trial, except that action. Mr. Garland, the plaintiff, still retains a lien on the Bear river canal, which is considered ample security for the amount of his claim.

Ogden Enjoined.

The injunction suit of William H. Whipple vs Ogden city, which is an action brought to restrain the city from paying Contractor Williamson, on the paving of Twenty-first street out of the proceeds of the city's tax base, has come to a standstill. The case was called up on the defendant filed by J. S. Kimball, city attorney, in which it was held that the facts in the case were not sufficient to constitute an action in the courts. He argued in behalf of the plaintiff that one side, in another phase of the question was ably considered, the defendant was overruled and ten days were given in which to make answer; provided the plaintiff file an appeal bond in the sum of \$1,000. This action was to prevent the city from spending money to prevent the paving out of the city's streets, but it looks much like nothing the sides after the horse is broken, so the cause has already approximated \$1,000,000.
