SENATE.

WASHINGTON, 11.—Morrill re-

ported, without amendment, the

Senate bill authorizing the con-

version of national gold banks.

Cameron, Pennsylvania, submit-

ted a joint resolution providing for

a commission to consider and re-

port what legislation is needed for

the better regulation of commerce

among States. Referred.

The Vice President submitted a

communication from the Secretary

of the Interior in answer to the

resolution requiring that addition-

al clerical force will be necessary to

the pension and surgeon general's

offices to secure to applicants for

pensions a prompt adjustment of

their claims. Committee on Pen-
