SUNNYSIDE. WIDESPREAD DISASTER,

Caused by the Parning of the Coal Crushing Plants.

Special Correspondence. Sunnyside, Carbon Co., Oct. 28 .- A

disaster has befallen this place that will be keenly felt by the workmen as well as by the Utah Fuel company. As elegraphed yesterday a fire destroyed the three coal crushing plants operated here for the purpose of producing coke. Between 4:30 and 5 p. m., Oct. 26, a place of iron or steel went into the dis-integrator and the friction caused sparke to fly and set the coal dust on fire at the bottom of the elevator shaft.

Like a flash it shot up the elevator shaft. Like a flash it shot up the elevator shaft with a loud noise, setting fire to the bridge timbers. Willing hands soon attached the hose to the fire hydrant and extinguish-

nose to the first and extinguish-ed the flames. The place was given a thorough soaking, and was closely ex-amined by General Superintendent Smith, Supt. Robert Howard and oth-ers, who falled to find any indications of smouldering fire. At 10 p. m. the fire whistle was heard series and the building was accessed.
