Editors Deseret News:

I am sorry that there is not a better understanding of that direful disease, diphtheria, than there seems to be in this city. Now there are six different types of that disease all requiring different kinds of treatment; no two types can be cured by the same medicine and all complications must be taken into consideration and treated accordingly.

For the benefit of the sufferer I will give a treatment for diphtheria complicated with croup, the most dangerous type of that disease.

Take tincture of phytolacca oz., tincture of valerian 1 oz., distilled water, 4 oz., mix, dose one teaspoonful every 30 to 60 minutes according to the severity of the case. In case of great debility from the poisoned state of the blood and the throat is ulcerated badly, take hydrochloric acid dilute, saturated solution of chlorate of potass of each one ez., mix, dose two drops in water every hour, using as a wash to the throat permangenate of potass 10 grs, tincture of balladonna five drops water 4 oz., mix.




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
