Greater speed is to come. Records will fall, year by year. Meanwhile there is one speed record that stood 25 years ago—yes, almost 35 years ago, and still stands. In London, on June 1, 1874, W. Per-kins walked an officially recorded mile in 6 minutes 23 seconds. His record in 6 minutes 23 seconds. His record stands today.

Last season he made no attempt to train and race Uncle, the best horse that he brought to California, but this winter every horse in his string will be called upon to help swell the Hildreth total in the winning owners' list. In important races he will not de-

pend upon a single candidate, but will have at least two, and possibly more, rave at least two, and possibly more, starters to insure, victory. Montgom-ery, Fitzherbert and Dandellon prob-ably will represent Hildreth in the opening handicap in furtherance of this plan, Hildreth has so many good lorses available that he can success-ully learry out such a policy.
