Release of Wm. Fife from Asylum—Probate Orders—Licensed to Marry.

Logan, Cache Co., Dec. 5.—Judge Hart today issued an order directing the release from the Utah asylum for the insane of Wm. Fife, formerly resident of Providence, this county. The order was made upon the application of James Fife, brother of William, who with Fife and Wm. B. Low, signed a bond for \$500, guaranteeing the safe keeping of the insane. Wm. Fife has been under treatment at the asylum for about ten years, and is considered sufficiently cured of his malady to justify his maintenance among his relatives. His mental affliction was of an intermittent character, and under the spell he was impelled to inflict great bodily injury upon anyone near him, but during his lucid movements was as harmless as a child.

The company had for a premium, and appealed from Judge Hart's decision that when the amount of the loan, with specific interest, had been paid by partial payments the obligation was cancelled and Thomas was entitled to the cancellation.
