PROF. STEPHEN'S LETTER.

Superintendent Thos. C. Griggs—Since seeing you and also since I find that the officers of the Sabbath schools of the Salt Lake Stake are taking up in real earnest, the musical instruction classes for the Sunday school children, and my eagerness to see this very important matter made a huge and permanent success, I have been thinking how it can be made even still lighter financially on such as have little children, but few dollars. As a result, I propose the following: That to every child enrolled, and paying its one dollar for each year, I favor at the time of admission to a grand class concert to be given during the season in the large Tabernacle each week 25 cents be given. These tickets can be sold by the owner to friends interested, or any one perfect for that matter, and the child has its dollar refunded, and the class expenses, of hall, fire, accompanist, assistants, also the concert expenses are all assured, if a goodly number are enrolled. Should they attend, they are not to be charged for their tickets from the students, such admission money to go into the Tabernacle choir fund, to help it maintain itself. Thus your Sunday school musical training classes become practically free, by working out their expenses. The incentive and delight of giving a public performance is supplied. The interest of parents and public is kept alive by hearing their work, and noting their progress.
