Elder Joseph H. Parry, stake secretary of the sabbath schools, Salt Lake County, reported that there were fortyseven sabbath schools organized, with an enrollment of ten thousand children; an average attendance of nearly six thousand, or a little less than fifty per cent. of the children of the Latter. day Saints residing in this stake.

There are one thousand officers and teachers, with an average attendance of six hundred and fifty.

A few of the schools are thoroughly graded from the primary to the highest theological classes, and they are carried on with a great deal of success and satisfaction.

Most of the schools are using the leastet lessons prepared by the Deseret Sunday School Union Board. These leastets have proved better aids to the Sunday school work than anything ever before devised; and "their discontinuance," be said, "is very much regretted by every school which has used them." them."

There is an active missionary committee of 11 who also visits all the Sunday schools in the Stake, and their abors are attended with good-effects; but better results would follow if these brethren were so situated as to visit

each school once a month.

Counsellor C. W. Penrose read the report of fast offerings of this Stake,

which made a good showing.

President Angus M. Cannon said it would be well for each organization in this Stake in making out reports, to make a condensed one of the totals of numbers and important matters, etc., to be read before the conference, and in addition to send in a com-plete statistical report for filing.

He said that reports were received from fourteen quorums of Elders, all of which were represented in good working order. Much interest was taken by the brethren in their meetings, although the attendance was not as large as it should be. Lectures were delivered which were very profitable to the members. Occasionally the time was occupied bearing testimonies.

The Tenth, Thirteenth, Fourteenth, Fifteenth, Seventeent and Eighteenth quorums of Elders failed to submit any
