It is many miles from where the search is being prosecuted to the nearest telegraph point, and it may be days after an encounter before anything is known of what happened. Curry has lots of friends in the country through which he is passing, and they will aid him to reach the rendez-vous of his gang, where he will be safe in the fastnesses of the Bear Paw mountains from pursuit or capture. When last heard from on Saturday he was only ten miles from his destination and well mounted. As the posses only get started this afternoon, the chances are all in Curry's favor.
