## EDITORIAL NOTES.

Talmage talks about "hag making mouths to heaven." See telegram from New York. If any one can make worse mouths than Talmage, ought to be hanged, hanged, hanged. There is not a mouth like the Brooklyn harlequin's in any tabernacle in the United States.

The Mark Lane Express after giving a summary of averages of the various crops in England this year, remarks: "On the whole, we regret that we cannot congratulate farmers and the nation at large on a successful harvest. If wheat, barley, peas and potatoes are superior to last year's crops, and mangolds a little better, other crops are decidedly worse. Even the superiority in the quality of the grain, which was confidently expected, may not be realized, as the weather has been so wet since the harvest became general."

Pierre Kropotkin, a Russian nihilist refugee, also known as Levashoff, who has been expelled from Switzerland by a decree of the Federal Council, was chief editor of the *Revolte*, a most violent revolutionary paper, published in Geneva. It was also principally due to his efforts that the walls of this city were covered last April with proclamations, and protesting against the execution of the assassins of the late Czar, Kropotkin was one of the delegates present at the Revolutionary Congress recently held in London, and greatly contributed towards the adoption of a resolution approving the use of dynamite as a means to accomplish the objects of the Socialist party.

A new City Hall has been erected in Philadelphia, of which the inhabitants of the city of brotherly love are very proud. Its dimensions are given as follows: From north to south, 498 feet 5 inches; from east to west, 470 feet; area, 41 acres; height of main tower, 235 feet; width at base, 80 feet; center of clock face 461 feet above pavement; diameter of clock face, 20 feet; height of upper balcony, 236 feet; total number of rooms in building, 830; total amount of floor-room is 144 acres; height of each corner pavilion, 202 feet 10 inches; height of corner towers, 181 feet; height of basement story, 18 feet 9 inches; height of principal story, 33 feet 6 inches; height of second story, 35 feet 7 inches; height of third story, center pavilions, 26 feet 6 inches; height of third story wings, 21 feet 3 inches; height of third story curtains, 20 feet 6 inches; height of corner pavilions, 15 feet; height of attic of corner towers, 13 feet 6 inches; height of corner statues, 35 feet; height of figures on corner domes, 17 feet 6 inches; height of figures on corner domes, 12 feet 10 inches.

## Z. C. M. I.

The regular annual meeting of the stockholders of the Institution took place at 5 o'clock this afternoon, in the Council House. The attendance was good and the proceedings were not only gratifying but full of interest to the community, because the facts, figures and results thus made known, demonstrated the continued success of a principle which the people of this territory have an abiding faith in, that is, to co-operation.

This great institution, organized and carried on for and in the interests of the people, was never more prosperous than today, and despite competition and the small margin of profit visible in this day and age of close figuring, when every purchaser comes to market, and to first cost and freight of almost every article he buys, it is gratifying to state that not only has a dividend of four per cent. for the six months been declared, but a handsome margin of some \$60,000.47 will be carried to the reserve or surplus fund.

During the past half year, so we gather from the Secretary's report, which, embodied in the President's report, was read to the meeting, there were purchased some \$1,260,091.73 worth of goods; \$120,709.62 was paid for freight, and the cash receipts were \$1,084,235.45. These are truly large sums, but the Institution's business is of such proportion that only "big figures" can represent it now.

The Institution, it appears, is now subdivided into sixteen departments and branches, accounts with each, and kept separate, that at the end of each half year the amount of goods purchased, the number of times each particular stock has been turned over, the cost of selling, and profits realized can be seen at a glance. A complete and thorough check system has been introduced, not only is a great safeguard against loss through errors and carelessness, but it accurately registers daily the sales of each employee, and all errors made. Thus, at the end of each day, month or half year, the officers of the Institution consider that they can tell with certainty the value of each salesperson, and rate him accordingly. The system upon which the large business is conducted has been elaborated by years of care and experience, and is as perfect, perhaps, as can be found in any commercial house in the country.

Z. C. M. I. enjoys the proud reputation of dealing justly and honestly with all its patrons. A child sent by its parents to make a purchase, obtains just as good an article and at as low price as if the purchase had been made by an adult, as the parents themselves. All the care for goods sent to the house by mail, is alloted with scrupulous care, and, in fact, the house prides itself upon the skill

and integrity with which it fills commissions for absent customers. To illustrate this trait of Z. C. M. I. we will mention a circumstance that occurred but a short time since, in the nature of a complaint that reached the Superintendent. One of the numerous country stores had sent orders for goods by mail, leaving much of the selection of articles to the judgment of the house, which were filled with accustomed care and skill. Subsequently, the buyer for this same store visited the city and made personal selections and purchases. Shortly after, the manager of the country store wrote to the Superintendent of Z. C. M. I. complaining that his store was better served when he ordered his goods by mail than when his buyer personally visited the Institution and made his own selections. In the one case, the Z. C. M. I. salesman felt that his experience and good judgment and the honor of the house were at stake; in the other, the buyer was courteously served with what he asked for, and there the salesman and establishment's responsibility ceased.

As one of the solid, substantial institutions of the Territory, Z. C. M. I. exerts a potent influence on our commerce. Its career since the spring of 1899 has been one of which all connected with it should feel gratified. A fair and equitable remuneration has not only been paid to its stockholders, but the people generally have received vast benefits in cheap, reliable articles of merchandise.

The manufacturing departments of Z. C. M. I. demand a more extended notice than our limited space this afternoon will allow; we will therefore merely say that they are steadily growing, and are all doing well. So great is the demand for some lines of home made clothing, that it is found impossible to keep a stock in hand. The tannery, boot and shoe factory and home made clothing department furnish employment to 220 hands. To these add a force of 170 salaried, laborers and clerks, and it totals the total to 400 employees. Steam power will shortly be introduced into the boot and shoe and home made clothing factories, which will not only increase the capacity of these departments, but will further cheapen the cost of production, and consequently lower the selling price, which will in turn benefit the people.

We congratulate the officers and Directors of the Institution upon their successful management of its affairs, and trust that as the year rolls round, Z. C. M. I. will in the future, as in the past, stand at the head and front of the commercial houses of Utah.

### Fatal Catting Army.

JERSEY, N. J., Oct. 4.—The late night Ed. McDermott, a notorious character, killed John Keefe instantly and fatally wounded Barney McDermott, using a knife. In each instance the insurance was involved, McDermott fleeing the row. He was locked up.

### Yorktown.

NEW YORK, Oct. 4.—The French frigate *Magicienne*, Admiral Halligan, and the French gunboat *Paroquet*, Captain Paul Dela Barre, in company with the flag ship *Jennesse*, *Vandalia* and *Yanbu* proceeded down the bay after the arrival of the storm ships *Canada* and *Herder*, with guests, invited by government to attend the Yorktown celebration. Both vessels are expected to arrive on Wednesday. The salutes were fired early at Staten Island and later at the Navy Yard in honor of the French fleet. Officers, some of whom were making visits to the United States vessels in the harbor, and to the commandant.

### Silk Factory Closed.

The factory of the New York Silk Manufacturing Company, located at Marion, N. J., was attached two weeks ago and the factory closed. Work was resumed this morning, but the factory again closed.

### Melley and Anti-Monopoly.

Tammany Hall had an anti-monopoly meeting tonight. John Kelly in his speech said, "We ask the democratic party to send no men to the State or national legislature unless it is understood that they go there to legislate for the interest of the whole people, and not in the interest of corporations organized during the last quarter of a century."

### Sugar Thieves.

NEW YORK, Oct. 4.—The general foreman of the sugar refining house of Matthews & Wetherill, of Jersey City, and the foreman of the stove-drawers employed by the firm, have been arrested with eight lightermen, charged with the theft of sugar in transit from the storehouse in Brooklyn to the refinery.

### Moses Arraigned.

Ex-Governor Moses was arraigned today for further complaint of great frauds brought against him by John D. Townsend.

The Times says: Moses' plan was to go to Jefferson Market with his law partner and procure a search warrant from Justice Morgan, and with this process the property of White could be seized and they would be forced to make a settlement.
