MT. NEBO CO. IS RESTRAINED.

Suit Filed in District Court Today By Marie Larson Anderson, A Stockholder.

WHAT COMPLAINT CONTAINS.

Alleges That H. M. Short Made False Statements About Condition of Mine, also Assessments.

An injunction suit was filed in the district court today by Marie Larson Anderson against the Mt. Nebo Mining company and H. M. Short to restrain defendants from attempting to sell 4,000 shares of stock in said company owned by plaintiff, and upon which she claims an illegal assessment was levied. Judgment is also asked for the sum of \$1,000, which plaintiff paid for the stock under the alleged false inducements and representations of defendant, H. M. Short.

It is alleged that in February, 1905, defendant Short represented a plaintiff that a good body of ore had been found in the mine, and that it was ready to ship ore and would declare a dividend by July of the same year. He also represented that no assessment would ever be levied upon said stock. Acting upon such representations plaintiff purchased 4,000 shares of the stock and paid \$1,000 for the same. She now alleges that the representations were false and were made by defendant for the purpose of defrauding her. She asks judgment for \$1,000, and tenders the return of the stock.

GOOD MARKET DAY.

Uncle Sam Con. in Demand at an Advance in Price.

This was an unusually big day for trade on the floor of the Salt Lake Stock & Mining Exchange. Uncle Sam Consolidated was the center of attraction during the regular call and the stock changed readily at prices ranging from 35 up to 37 1/2 cents. Lower Mammoth sold, too, but at a decline. Daily-Judge found demand at \$8 and better.

The Pumas-Eureka mine, for years one of the richer mines of California, has been sold to Charles D. Stark, a millionaire of Newport, Rhode Island, and a number of other Rhode Island capitalists for \$25,000.

MARKET OPENED DISCOURAGINGLY.

New York, Oct. 16.—Prices started downward at the opening of the stock market today in sympathetic response to the heaviness of the London market.

Moderate pressure was continued all through the morning, the leading loss of a point in St. Paul, Northwestern, Delaware & Hudson, L. & N., Locomotive and Steeling, in Wisconsin Central preferred and 2 in Canadian Pacific.

Prices moved daily toward recovery which was complete for a few of the leaders. Amalgamated Copper was freely taken above \$3, Central R. & N. Y., Southern, Cotton Oil, Pacific Mail and Chicago Union Traction preferred.

Leading stocks held firmly around Saturday. Most of the market opened to show strength but the general buying was not sustained with any degree of confidence. Reaction set in, however, and the market closed with a decline of 3/8.

WEST QUINCY SUED.

Dr. White Wants an Accounting for Certain Interests in Company.

Manager G. D. E. Turner of the West Quincy Mining company was served with a summons on Saturday, which marked the beginning of a suit in the district court in which Dr. John T. White appears as the plaintiff. The West Quincy and Mr. Turner are named as defendants and an accounting is demanded for a certain interest in the company, of which Dr. White alleges he is the owner.

Manager Turner on Saturday evening made the following statement in reference to the case: "White was president of the J. I. C. company which was organized with a lease and bond on certain mining ground as its basis. This company went to pieces in debt. Its affairs were liquidated and the company went out of existence by the signature of Mr. White as its president. All this took place before the West Quincy company was formed. The present company was formed by the actual owners of the ground and the stock of the company represents the actual ground. White is only making a bluff. He has no legal or moral claim against either me or the West Quincy."

First Shipment of Bullion.

The first shipment of bullion from the Auris King mine, located in the northern part of Elko county, Nev., and near the camp of Mountain City, has arrived at the Ogden office of that company, which has been subjected to mill treatment averaging about \$30 in gold to the ton. R. P. Hunter is manager of the company.

Chihuahua is to have an exposition of mines of a permanent character and Governor Creel has presented to the organization committee of the society his fine collection of mines, which has been gathering for years. This collection is a most extensive one, well classified and very representative of the mining resources of Mexico and especially of those of Chihuahua. It is the expectation of the mining interests of Chihuahua that the exposition will do a great deal in advertising the resources of Chihuahua.
