SENATE.

WASHINGTON, 13.—Senator Voorhees

offered a resolution which went over to

to-morrow, directing the secretary of the

interior to withhold for the purpose of

his approval of patents or certificates

for lands selected by the Northern Pacific

Railway in lieu of others sold by the

scrupulously regard the public interest

and the fact that the bill was to be

passed by a vote of 75 to 25.

the silver dollar, and no adoption by

the United States of a new currency

of silver and gold according to the

market value of these two precious

metals. All we could do was to

drift along until the inevitable ex-

haustion of gold, and the disappearance

of silver coinage, and its conversion

into an article of merchandise, should

reduce all values to a silver standard.

He said the National Bank currency

was the best in the world, and alluded

to the fact that even in the darkest

times of the panic of 1873 our money

was valued more than 6 or 7 per cent.
