Be it ordered by the County court of Salt Lake County, pursuant to an act of the Legislative Assembly of the Territory of Utah, entitled "An Act establishing District and Precinct Pounds and prescribing regulations for conducting the same, and for disposing of stray animals, approved February 13, 1872"; That District and Precinct Stray Pounds be and the same are hereby established, as hereinafter provided; and

Be it further ordered, that the following named persons be and are hereby appointed District and Precinct Pound keepers of their respective Pounds, as follows, to wit:

Second Precinct, Salt Lake City, Joseph Horne.  
South Cottonwood Precinct, James R. Miller.  
West Jordan Precinct, Samuel Bateman.

Mill Creek Precinct, John Morgan.  
Big Cottonwood precinct, Caleb D. Brinton.

Fort Herriman precinct, Ensign Stocking.

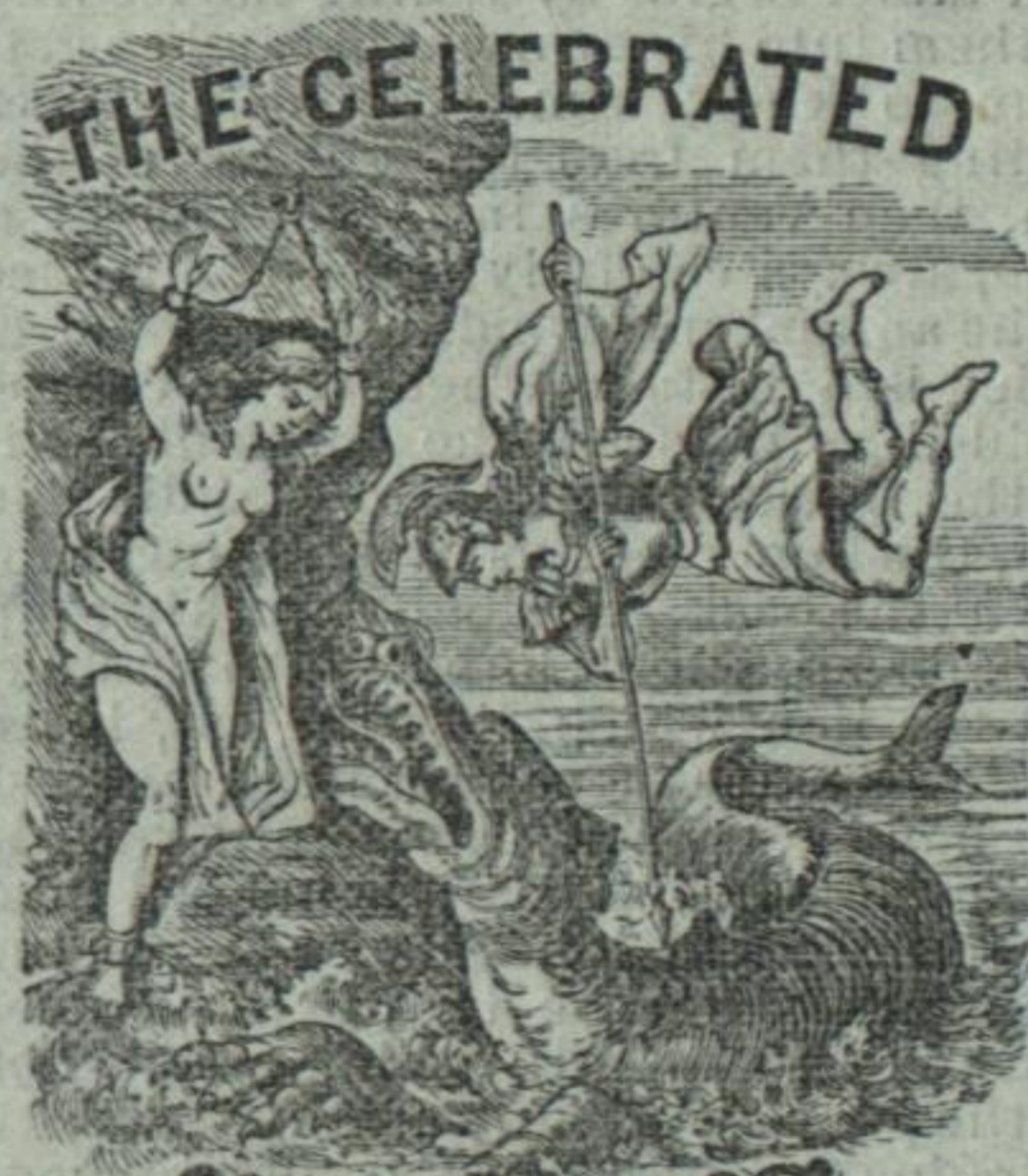
