HOME RULE FEUD

A Quarrel in the Commons
May End in a Duel.

AFTER ORANGE SPEAKERS.

Not Likely to Have Compromises
Legislators Arrested.

INTERED MR. GLADSTONE.

Arriving from Church to be
Greeted with Hisses and the Word
"Traitor."

LONDON, March 6.—Colonel Stamford, member for North Warwick and grand master of the orangemen, addressed the terms to the members of both houses of parliament. William Howitt, a Radical, challenged him to repeat his words outside the house. They met this evening in the lobby of the commons. Howitt said: "You are a scoundrel and a scold of the lowest order." Colonel Glazebrook, who by the way is not a Radical, but a moderate, and a member of the committee of inquiry into the killing of Mr. Garrison, said: "You particularly, Mr. Gladstone, are the party of cabinet reading to me."

Both men were very cool and seemed to have other than a political quarrel. The peers sent three of their members and members of the commons gathered around in anticipation of seeing the last blow in the threatened duel shot off in the house of commons. The government had not made any demand. Howitt asserted that no arrests in either house had been made up to now.
