A bill requiring reserves of na-tional banking associations to be kept in standard gold and silver coins of the United States in lieu

proportion of coin required to be kept as reserve by the national bauks in the cities named and the proportion required to be maiotain-ed by all other national banks. The main object of the bill is, however, to effect a distribution throughout the country of the considerable portion of coin that has accumulat-ed in the United States Treasury
