OF LICENSES. in ACT authorizing County Courts to gri Licenses. SECTION 1.-Be it enacted by the Govern and Legislative Assembly of the Territo of Utah. That on and after the first day A WONDERFUL FLASK. April, eighteren hundred and eighty-four, person shall be permitted to carry on t business of merchants, retailers, peddie auctioneers, brokers, pawnbrokers, mon changers, invelers, traveling showman, the trical performances, circus, and menageri-without first obtaining a license there chargers, thevelers, traveling showman, thea-trical performances, circus, and menageries, without first obtaining a license therefore from the county courts in their respective gounties, as hereinafter provided. SEC. 2.—The county court in their respec-tive counties are hereby authorized to pro-vide for the granting of licenses, as contem-plated in the first section of this act. They shall also provide a suitable book of printed forms with stubs, said stubs shall contain a duplicate copy of all licenses issued, and they shall be numbered consecutively; said county courts shall fix the price of all licenses granted by them, which price shall be uniform for all licenses of the same class and shall not exceed for any one license on any business, named in this act the same of one hundred dollars for any one yoar; *Pro-vided*. That the price fixed for a quarter yearly license may be made the price for any line loss than three months; and said coun-ty courts shall require payment for all licenses invariably in advance. Upon the applicant paying the required amount to the county clerk, said clerk shall issue the de-sired license for any the response of any clerk, said clerk shall issue the de-sired license for any the structure.
