

EDITORIAL NOTES.

Coal has been discovered at Grouse Creek, near the line of the Central Pacific. This will be a fine thing both for the road and the discoverers.

The two towers of the Cologne cathedral, which is now nearly completed after centuries of work, are the highest in the world. They are 524 feet 11 inches and 515 feet 1 inch high, respectively, while St. Peter's at Rome is but 469 feet 2 inches. The ridge tiles of the Cologne cathedral are 360 feet 3 inches from the ground, while the top of the dome of St. Paul's in London is only 4 feet 10 inches higher.

The New York *Herald* commenting on the passage by the State Senate of the woman suffrage bill says: "The public will enjoy the rare spectacle of a measure, without any money in it going through both houses." This is a feather in the cap of the woman's rights movement, but a sad reflection on the motives that usually govern the New York State legislators.

The example set by some ladies in Lancashire, England, a few weeks ago, is an admirable one for their American sisters on whose hands time hangs heavily and who desire to do something out of the common way. They each set out with their own hands a tree on a newly-opened street. There were forty-eight silver beeches in all, and when the gentlemen heard of it, they turned out, too, and made a holiday of the tree-planting. It is a sort of thing which might become contagious with public advantage.

Brutes, called men in the East, who beat their wives with their fists and kick them with their heavy boots, get off with a few days' imprisonment, so we learn from the New York *Herald*, and the offense is quite common in that "Christian" city. One woman has tried her hand at making practical the adage, "What is sauce for the goose is sauce for the gander," and has given her husband daily doses of the strap. He endured it for a long time, but finally made complaint, and the magistrate let the woman off with a reprimand. Offenses against the person are counted less than offenses against property, it is evident, in Gotham.

Our Washington correspondent "Adams" says: "There are rumors here of a combination of Southern Republicans to have Governor Davis of Texas nominated for Vice President. This is another alarming sign to the Grant people, for it seems to be in the interest of Senator Blaine. Already it is said several Southern delegations to Chicago are committed to this programme, to have the extreme north-east and south-west represented on the National ticket. Texas, of course, will lead off with it, and Arkansas is about ready to abandon its Grant instructions in the interest of the Blaine and Davis movement."

While the public debt of the United States and also that of Great Britain has been considerably reduced during the last fourteen years, the former over twenty-seven per cent, and the latter a little more than three per cent., nearly all the European Powers have been increasing their liabilities. France's debt has increased 48 per cent.; Russia's has increased 188 per cent.; Spain's has increased 150 per cent.; Italy's has increased 123 per cent.; Turkey's has increased 421 per cent.; Germany's has increased 71 per cent.; Switzerland has increased her debt 833 per cent. on account of public works like the St. Gothard tunnel. Denmark has increased hers a trifle over seven per cent.

Have we not a privileged class in this country? The Fourteenth Amendment and the laws passed in pursuance thereof were intended to secure to colored citizens equal civil rights with white citizens; but they have been so construed by the courts that the colored "pusson" is exalted above the "white trash" and obtains peculiar privileges over and above that protection. A colored man and his wife were refused admission to a public entertainment in Philadelphia some years ago, upon tickets they had purchased. They brought suit, and the lower court awarded them \$800 damages. The case was appealed on the ground that the plaintiffs could only recover the amount they paid for their tickets. The Supreme Court of Pennsylvania has affirmed the judgment of the lower court, and theatre lessees had better be careful how they comport themselves towards "gentlemen of color."
