THE TWELFTH DISTRICT.

Prominent Republican Makes an Estimate of the Result. prominent Republican sends to state headquarters the following esti-mate of the results of the election in the Tweifth senatorial district, com prising Carbon, Emery, Grand, San San Juan and Ulatah counties. Its author has stumped the entire district and his

estimate should therefore be of interest "Carbon gave a Republican majority of 125 in 1900. This year she will elect

her representative and increase her majority to 200. "Emery gave a Democratic majority of 130 in 1900. This will be reduced this year to about 80 and the Republicans

have a good fighting chance in elect-ing their representative.

"Grand gave a Democratic majority in 1900 of 27. She will this year return a Republican representative and will give a Republican majority of 23.

"San Juan gave a Republican ma-jority of 10 in 1999. She will this year return a Republican to the Legislature and increase her majority to 30.

"Untah gave a Democratic majority of 124 in 1999. This will this year be reduced to 75, and local conditions will elect the Republican representative to the Legislature. The majorities of the district should
