ALBANY.—It is understood, unofficially, that the new high dam across the Oswego river, near Oswego, torn away yesterday, belonged to the State, and was near completion.

HALIFAX.—Five bodies were recovered from the wreck to-day, four steamer passengers and a sailor, all unrecognized.
