Showers of Snow, Dark Clouds, and Waves of icy Cold.

THE VENEZUELA CRISIS OVER.

The Arctic Festival Coming a Flurry
In Commercial Cities—Notes
on Various Topics.

London, Dec. 25.—(Cronkite of the Associated Press)—The most intense feeling of gloom has been cast over the Christmas holidays by the showers of sleet, clouds of dense fog and waves of icy cold which have been the weather features of the east, driving Indians almost entirely into the houses and the police cars, causing the streets in labor under a faintly deserted appearance, and the other hand, making the happy seeing their families with an air of undivided content meet pleasant to contemplate. VENEZUELA EXCITEMENT OVER.

The difficulty between Great Britain and the United States regarding Venezuela is still the leading topic of conversation in the metropolis, manifested especially as from the viewpoint of politics, the crisis is regarded as being over, while the attention centers in the Spanish aspect.

The reports called over to-day that the United States government which is expected to include ex-Minister Edward J. Phelps and ex-Minister Robert T. Lincoln, met with no success, however, in securing the services of the most modest habitation.

CHAMBER OF MILITARY FORCES.

The war has had the effect of arousing interest in the organization of Canadian military forces and similar schemes of military cooperation between them have been made.

Our friends in Canada have no doubt that the Canadian military force will be organized on a large scale, and the American generals have ever demanded more than a battalion of infantry or a regiment of cavalry."

The Cuban correspondent expresses the opinion that the Canadian militia is as well organized and trained as the British militia.

The *Morning Post* prints an article on naval questions in the United States during which it points out the alleged want of skill and the deficiency of official representation in the administration of the docks and harbors and construction of the warships, and demands that the navy department is a blot on the record.
