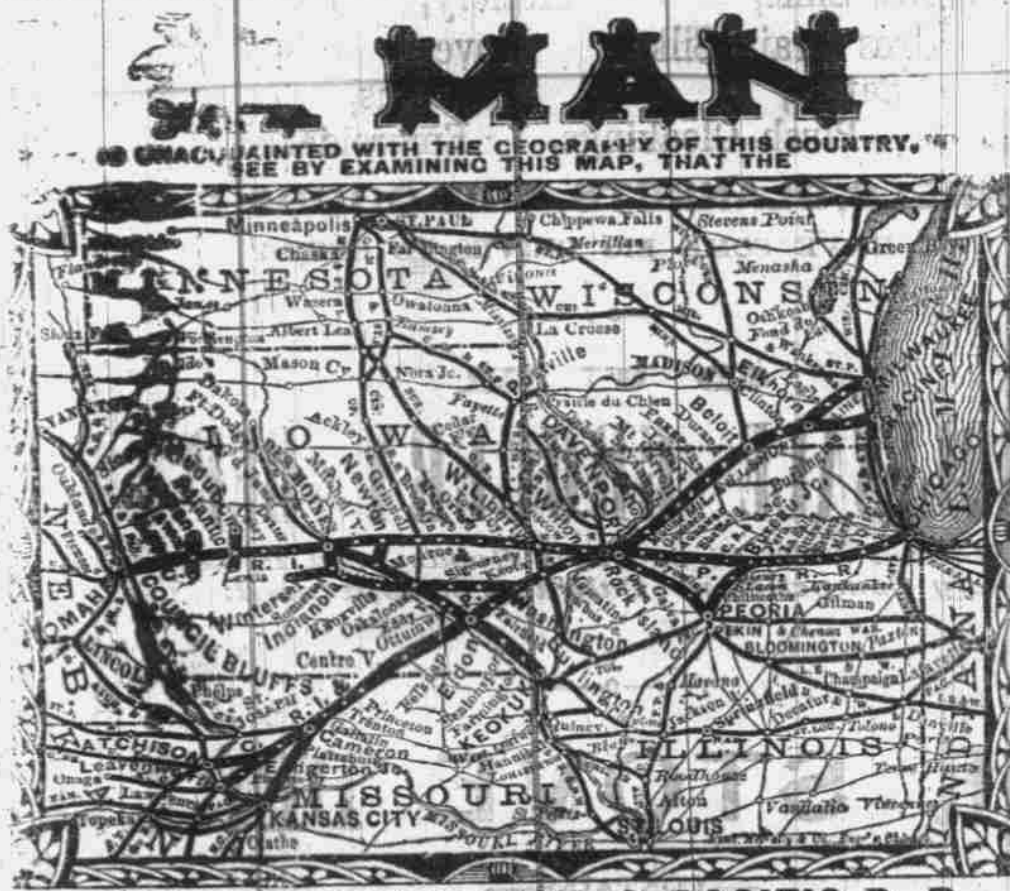

Correspondence.

INVERCARGILL, New Zealand, October 5, 1882.

Editor Desert News:

Being called on a mission to this land at last April Conference, I prepared myself, and on my arrival I found many friends in Greenville, Beaver County, being accompanied by my wife and son, arriving in Salt Lake City on the 27th. After visiting friends and relatives, and making the necessary arrangements for the journey, in connection with the other brethren, we left Salt Lake City on the 28th day of May, arriving in Auckland on the 4th, at 11:30 a. m. On May the 8th we boarded the steamship City of Sydney, 5,600 tons burden, Captain J. A. Corry in command, and sailed out at 3 p. m.

On the 15th we arrived at Honolulu. On landing we had the pleasure of meeting Bro. H. H. Cliff, of Provo, and a Mr. W. W. Barber, of Utah, the ship having to stop a few hours, gave us the opportunity to go with the brethren and partake of some refreshments and view the city. We had a most pleasant time. Many of the native brethren and sisters came to see us.

On the 27th we sighted Navigator's Island, and on the 28th, 8 p. m., we arrived in Auckland, New Zealand. We were received by the brethren and sisters of Auckland and very kindly entertained. President Bromley was in Christchurch, and we received word for three of us to go there, the other to remain in Auckland accordingly. Myself took leave of the Saints and Brother Greenwood and, after four days' rough sailing down the coast of New Zealand, we arrived in Lytleton harbor, and were met by President Wm. Bromley and Elder W. Barber. We took train to Christchurch, six miles distant. We were kindly received by the Saints, with Brother Wm. Barber. I was appointed to labor in the Lytleton district, the country distributing tracts and presenting the gospel to the people whenever an opportunity presented itself. We found the people much opposed to the truth, so much so that they would not let us enter their schools and churches to give us a hearing. However, we held meetings in a private hall and in the homes of the people. During our stay in Lytleton we removed considerable prejudice from the minds of some, and it is to be hoped that we have laid the foundation for a more permanent work.

After laboring there a month we traveled back to Chyp district, ten miles, distributing tracts and expounding the gospel to all who would hear and receive. We labored in the Lytleton district for a month distributing tracts and talking to those that had courage enough to hear us and holding meetings with a few at a time. Most of the preaching is done by the friends, at the homes of those who are disposed to read our tracts. In Christchurch I received instructions from Pres. Bromley to come and labor in this district in connection with Elder Jos. Bostow, of Logan. Since my arrival here we have been traveling in the surrounding districts, distributing tracts and presenting the Gospel to all those that will hear. We find many no bigoted and prejudiced that they manifest a spirit of persecution towards the Elders, but through the blessing of Lord there is now and then one honest person added to the Church. The people of this city think us occasionally by warning the people to look out for us, which of course they do out of curiosity and inquiry. There are two very good men including Pres. Bromley in this land, who are working very diligently to spread the principles of life and salvation among the people and gathering out the honest in heart. The Desert News is received here by many of the Elders, who circulate them among the people, and is a means of removing much prejudice.
