

The Czar's Title—Where It Came From

Among the prisoners taken in the battle of Narva, there was one who was a striking example of the revolutions of fortune. This was the eldest son and heir of the king of Georgia; he was termed the 'czarabé,' a word signifying prince, or son of a czar, among the Tartars, as in Moscow, for the word czar signified king among the ancient Scythians from whom these people are descended, and was not derived from the 'Caesars,' so long unknown to these barbarians. In such terms, Voltaire disposes of an historical question which is not without interest at the present time (see Charles XII, book 3). Opinions upon this point vary greatly.

Voltaire may have been right in asserting that the oriental nations had known and used the word czar or czar from a very remote period. The doubt only increases when one reads the formula which precedes all royal proclamations in Russia. "We, by the grace of God, emperor and autocrat of all the Russias, of Moscow, Kiev, Vladimir, Novgorod, etc., Tsar of the Kazan, Tsar of Astrakhan, Tsar of Poland and of Siberia, etc., Lord of Pskov and Grand Prince of Smolensk, of Lithuania, of Volhynia, of Podolia and of Finland, Prince of Estonia, of Livonia, of Courland, of Kurland and various other countries, Prince of the territory of Nijni-Novgorod, Tcherniof, etc., etc., etc."

Some writers pretend to trace in certain names of the Assyrian kings incontrovertible traces of this ancient designation: Nabonassar, Nabopolassar, Nebuchadnezzar, Belshazzar, etc., are to be considered, according to them, as compound names, the termination "sar" or "sar" signifying prince or general, and thus giving origin to the title "czar." In this way, Neirghissar would signify "Prince of Nerguel" or prince favored by Nerguel. (Nerguel was an Assyrian god.)

Mickiewicz, sharing this opinion, presents the Assyrians as forming part of the great Slavonic family. He sighs at the idea of seeing his unhappy race supporting the yoke of sovereignty dating enough to take a little which reminds one of Nebuchadnezzar, name in which he thinks to recognize that pride of which the Bible speaks, and which led the "saw" to wish to be adorned as a god. He remarks upon the striking analogy existing between different varieties of the name of this race and the designation of slavery. Serb or servus, from which comes the Latin servus; slave, slavon, esclavon, from which comes the French esclave. There is a great distance between this hypothesis and the origin which the Slavians themselves attribute to their name, viz., slava, glory.—Boston Transcript.

CHURCH BELLS.

The Best Are Made From the Metal of Old Cannon.

"No silver is used in church bells," said the bell founder. "People claim there is, but I have assayed many an old bell that came here to be broken up and never an ounce of silver did I find in one of them. For the best bells we use old cannon. They give us the purest amalgam we can get. The tower bell I am making now is composed of twelve tons of old cannon from Spain.

"These two molds, the core and the inner mold, the core and the inner mold, are what give the bell its sweetness. It is in their cut that the secret of bell founding lies. The core is the inner mold. It has the exact shape of the bell's inside. We fit the cope over the core and into the space between the molten metal is run. When the metal has hardened and cooled the bell is finished, save for its clappers. To tune bells it is necessary to chip little pieces out of them. Our bell tuner is a good musician. He has composed a number of hymns.—Philadelphia Bulletin.
