The wound was found to be doing well, and the inflamed gland in about the same condition as last night. Dr. Reyburn said at 9 a.m.: The swelling is no worse and the general condition of the President is a little better. The anxiety is somewhat lessened by the developments of the morning but the gravity of the situation is still apparent.
