A tall man, light-skinned, dark overcoat, wearing a handkerchief over his face, a la Shockey, and wearing a stiff hat, perpetrated a holdup about 11 o'clock last night at the corner of South Temple and First West. The victim was W. E. Paul, proprietor of the San Pedro saloon on South Temple.

Paul was on his way home when, at the point of a revolver, the robber began to demand money. "Name up," Paul's hands went up. The robber took from him \$85 and a check for \$5. He examined the money and then handed it and the check back saying he had no use for them.

"Now, don't you move until I get across the street or I may fill you full of lead," said the thug as he pocketed his revolver and walked away. Mr. Paul did not move a pace, but when he was in the direction of the police station and reported the robbery. He could not give much description of the holdup.
