Berlin, Dec. 3.—The government's first and decisive intimation that Emperor William would not be able to receive Mr. Kruger has created a profound impression throughout Germany. WAS PARADED THEN BEHEADED

Author of the Pao Ting Outrages in Tien Tsin Streets.

GERMANS LOSE TWENTY MEN

Fearful Mission Slaughter in Shan Si Province—Men, Women and Children Butchered.

Tien Tsin, Dec. 3.—Tang Wang Huang, the author of the outrages upon the Pao Ting Fu missionaries, arrived today and was paraded through the Victoria road in a cart under a strong German guard, previous to being handed over to the provisional government for execution.

GERMANS LOSE TWENTY MEN. Shanghai, Dec. 4.—It is reasserted in Tien Tsin that the Germans lost twenty killed and many wounded west of Pao Ting Fu, where they were attacked by 2,000 Boxers.

A quantity of loose powder exploded in the last assault occupied by the Boxers. It is supposed the explosion was caused by two Chinese smoking. Both Chinese were killed.

The shock was felt at Tien Tsin, four miles distant.

SLAUGHTER IN SHAN SI PROVINCE. Berlin, Dec. 3.—A special from China to the Volks Zeitung reports a fearful mission slaughter in the province of Shan Si. The first victims, the dispatch says, were a Catholic bishop and his coadjutors and four European priests.

The governor invited them to his house, pretending to give them better protection, but when they arrived their hands were tied. Then the governor himself butchered them all.

Next the governor went to the bishop's residence with a number of soldiers and seized six Marcelline sisters. He promised them money and also a number of Chinese priests, thirty Chinese sisters and 200 orphans from 3 to 10 years of age.

Mr. and Mrs. Atwater and their two little children, Mr. and Mrs. C. C. Price and their son, all of the American board, Mr. and Mrs. Lauren of the Swedish and Miss Edred, an English woman, were also butchered.

The story of these murders directly implicated Yu Hsien, the governor of Shan Si. As announced in a previous dispatch the Associated Press of Saturday last, members of Li Hung Chang's staff say the Chinese emperor will probably send Yu Hsien a silk robe which is an intimation that he must hang himself.

A number of reports have been published of the June massacres in Shan Si, some of the details being too horrible for publication. Men, women and children were butchered. Fifteen missionaries, who had hidden themselves in a cavern were, the dispatch says, tied to stakes and forced to drink the blood of the first victims. They were then killed.

A Chinese priest and two Christians, who attempted to escape, were caught and put in a small hut, where they were burned.

GERMANS RETURN TO PEKIN. Berlin, Dec. 3.—A dispatch from Field Marshal Count von Waldersee, commander-in-chief of the international forces in China, sent from Peking under date of Saturday, December 1st, says that after hoisting the German flag at Ming Jams and consulting several neighboring villages for the murder of Christians, the late Col. York's detachment, commanded by Gen. Gayl, returned to Peking in four columns by way of Yang Fang, Chien Pien, The Cheng, Zhang Jang and Niu Lan Shan, each about a day's march northward of Peking.

The Kalgan expedition, the dispatch also says, was very successful. Several thousand Chinese regulars, under the command of two generals, were driven in wild flight from the province of Chi Li to Shan Si.

The remains of the late Col. York have arrived at Peking.

COL. LISCUM'S REMAINS. They Lie in State in the Chapel of the Presidio.

San Francisco, Dec. 3.—The remains of Col. Liscum, the hero of Tien Tsin, lie in state in the chapel at the Presidio guarded by a detail from the garrison. Arrangements for the final disposition of the remains have not been completed, but it is expected they will be simple in character. On Wednesday afternoon the military funeral will be held over the casket in the chapel and the body will then be carried to the ferry depot for shipment on the overland train. A detail of troops from the command under Gen. Shafter will act as escort.

The remains will be shipped to the National cemetery at Arlington for interment.

Traveling Men's Association. Chicago, Dec. 3.—Scores of delegates and members of the Northwestern Traveling Men's association, residents of this State and various parts of the country, will attend the national convention of the organization to be held in this city December 27th. All the northwestern and north central States of the union will be represented at the gathering, also New Jersey, Pennsylvania and Massachusetts. The convention is regarded as one of great importance, many questions having come before the association during the last year to be settled.

Probably the most important topic for the delegates and travelers to discuss will be the railroad mileage book. The various passenger associations have, it is said, proposed that an increase of from 2,000 to 4,000 miles be made before a rebate be allowed. The travelers now receive their rebate when a 2,000 mile book is used and will object to the increase to 4,000 miles. With the present rate of 2,000 miles the traveler is paying a sum of two cents per mile after his rebate is paid. The proposed increase of mileage makes a greater amount of time elapse before the traveler is entitled to a rebate.

Nicaragua Route Favored. San Diego, Cal., Dec. 3.—Secretary H. P. Wood of the chamber of commerce has received a letter, dated the 27th ult., from Senator Morgan, in which the latter says:

"I have been informed tonight that the Walker commission have signed a report, said to be unanimous, but not yet made public, in favor of the Nicaragua route of the canal. This would seem practically to remove the Panama route from the contest."

EX-CADET O. L. BOOZ DIES.

His Parents Say Death Was the Result of Brutal Hazing at West Point.

Col. Mills, Superintendent of the Academy, Makes a Statement Denying the Charge.

Philadelphia, Pa., Dec. 3.—Oscar L. Booz, a former cadet at West Point military academy, who had been lying at the point of death at his home in Bristol, Pa., suffering from injuries which his parents claim were the result of hazing at the academy over two years ago, died today in great agony. The cause of death was throat consumption.

It is alleged by the young man's father that tobacco sauce was poured down his son's throat while the cadets were hazing him. The father also claims that red pepper was thrown in his eyes, hot grease poured on his bare feet, a tooth knocked out and that other brutal methods were indulged in.

Shortly after this, the father says, Oscar, because of his physical condition, was compelled to resign his cadetship. The young man grew steadily worse, but never would divulge the names of the cadets who ill-treated him. His parents told him it was his duty to tell, but his only answer was: "I went there expecting to die, and I never imagine should be given, and it would not be right to complain against the other boys."

WHAT COL. MILLS SAYS. West Point, N. Y., Dec. 3.—Before the death of young Booz at Bristol, Pa., was announced today, Col. A. L. Mills, superintendent of the military academy, made the following statement:

"The many statements made in the press of the country alleging that Oscar L. Booz was atrociously hazed while he was a cadet at the military academy to such an extent that he is now dying from its effects are untrue and ridiculous."

Booz was admitted to the military academy June 29, 1898, and resigned October 31, 1898. He was on sick report but once, on July 30th, when he was excused from the duties on account of diarrhoea. Had he been brutally beaten in a fight with another cadet or had his throat been injured in the manner claimed it would have been impossible for him to have avoided the sick report. The reason given for his resignation was weak eyes.

"His record shows he was in the last section in mathematics, and the marks he received to the date of his resignation were sufficient. I believe therein lies the real cause of his resignation, and I think it most probable that stories of his alleged ill-treatment arise from statements he has made in endeavoring to explain to his friends why he left the academy."

Aiding the Poor. New York, Dec. 4.—The fifty-seventh annual report of the New York association for improving the condition of the poor has just been issued. It shows that \$22,000 was spent by the relief department for 19,562 persons.

In the report of the board of managers, President T. L. Cutting says: "Of some 5,000 cases investigated, 2,000 had passed upon and closed during the year, the cause of distress in all instances is set down as lack of work; 1,100 instances as illness; the other causes operating were shiftlessness in 245 cases; intemperance in 312; old age in 87; and desertion in 321. Too often when we assign illness,

shiftlessness, intemperance and desertion as the cause of distress, we are overlooking the fact that the real underlying evil that has led to these results is persons in abnormal minds and unhealthy bodies."

SIX PEOPLE KILLED.

Chicago & Northwestern Boiler-house Explodes.

Chicago, Dec. 3.—Six railway employees were instantly killed and twelve people injured by the explosion of a boiler-house of the Chicago & Northwestern railroad, this morning. Three of the injured are said to be badly that they may die.

DIAD. August Chalmers, Scotch foreman, crushed by falling boiler while working near power-bolts.

Anthony Kruse, injured at power-house, internally bruised, died on the way to the hospital.

August Weiss, section hand, struck by boiler.

Joseph S. Smith, section hand, caught under boiler.

Henry Schmitt, 55 years old, died in building office of Northwestern road, neck broken by flying debris while walking past the boiler-house.
