They Must Not Fence Their Holdings So as to Bar Way to Public

Domain.

A circular has been sent out by Speclal Agent Hare of the interior department, which is signed by E. A. Hitchcock, secretary of the interior, relative to the removal of fences from the public domain, which removal must take place on or before April 1, 1907. Papers were not only sent to stock-men in general, but copies were sent to postmasters throughout the state, with instructions to have the same best of the consideration of the same posted in consideration of the prem-ities may be sufficiently warned. The fence law is a complicated one, and many persons who believe they are

and many persons who believe they are strictly in the line of their rights rela-tive thereto doubtless are viohaors of its provisions. A homesteader may not fence his own hand in such a man-ner as to prevent others from driving their cattle to and from grazing lands beyond. Such a condition may exist where fences are built in canyons, de-files, etc., and care must be taken to see that access to lands of the public domain is not in any way interfered with, with,

THE ORDER.

Following is the order issued: Washington, D. C., Jan. 3, 1907. The Commissioner of the General Land

Office: Sir-Referring to the circular of instructions to special agents of your of-fice, approved by me on Jan. 29, 1904, relative to their duties under the act of Feb. 25, 1885 (23 Stat., 321), entitled "An act to prevent unlawful occupancy of the public lands," you are advised that said circular is hereby amended and Burlied as follows: Strike out from said circular para-graphs five and six, and insert in lieu

Strike out from said circular para-graphs five and six, and insert in lieu thereof the following: "It shall be the duty of the special agent on receipt of any charge or com-plaint or upon information being ac-quired by him from any source, that an unlawful inclosure is being maintained by any person or persons, association, or corporation, to at once proceed to secure sufficient data, including a de-scription of the lands inclosed, with reascription of the lands inclosed, with reascription of the lands inclosed, with rea-sonable certainty, not necessarily by metes and bounds, nor by government subdivisions of surveyed land, but only so that the inclosure may be identified and the person or persons guilty of the violation, as nearly as may be, and by description if the name cannot, on rea-sonable inquiry, be ascertained, and to at once submit such case, with the data thus obtained, to the United States attorney for prosecution.

"It shall be the duty of the special agent, and he shall be so instructed, to be alert and vigilant to detect the existence of unlawful inclosures in his district and to proceed in accordance therewith as hereinabove directed, and that he is not to construe his duties as requiring that, before proceeding in the matter of an unlawful inclosure, there must first be filed with him a for-mal complaint by some person or per-

there must first be filed with him a for-mai complaint by some person or per-sons acquainted with the facts, but it shall be his duty, as hereinabove stated, to take the initiative himself."
