TITHING STORE BURGLARY.

THE OGDEN FIRE.

How the Brave Salt Lake Firemen Distinguished Themselves.

THE HOME DEPARTMENT SCORED.

Some of the Leading Individual Losses.

The Burned Building to be Restored.

Regarding Ogden's big fire yesterday the only newspaper of the Junction city said of the Salt Lake firemen this morning: When the two detachments of the Salt Lake department came running up the street from the depot the cheers of the crowd rang out in deafening chorus. Assistant Chief Downer led a detachment to the station, and followed by a half score of men with two lines of hose, axes and pikes, entered the building through the north entrance, from which the Ogden boys had been driven a short time before, and their efforts were soon followed by success, as the white smoke again attested. It soon became evident, however, that the only way to properly reach the fire was by means of the aerial and the men were withdrawn and ordered up the ladder. Their actions were the very antipodes of those of the Ogden firemen, who discarded ranks and showed only too plainly their lack of a head. The Salt Lake's scaled the walls by means of the ladder and circled throughout the building. After fighting the fire from the north and west for some time they descended to the basement where the flames were getting a tremendous headway, the fire having fallen down the elevator and ventilating shaft. It was a scorching children of flames, but the water thrown down the manholes had the desired effect. By this time the men on the east had extinguished the fire in the boiler and the basement and nothing but a smoldering mass of ruins remained.

At 12 o'clock the fire was out and save for all southeast apart being fanned into flame by the high wind nothing remained of the greatest conflagration Ogden has ever seen but the ruins it had left behind it.

There are many opinions as to the origin of the fire, and it is hard to say that it is not a mystery. It is thought that a lighted cigar thrown into a waste paper box in the water closet on the first floor caused the fire.
