

IN GREAT HASTE.

Foreclosure Proceedings Against the Union Pacific.

PAPERS NOW BEING PREPARED.

Huntington's Plan for a Commission to Settle the Indebtedness Not Likely to Succeed.

CHICAGO, Jan. 19.—The Post's Washington special says:

The government is making extraordinary haste in preparing the papers of the Union Pacific foreclosure proceedings. Secretary Cullum, Attorney General Harman, ex-Governor Hendley, an inhabit of the government, and Chairman Fitzgerald of the Union Pacific reorganization committee, and William H. Packer, its attorney, on the other hand, are in continuous session. The papers will probably be completed tomorrow and formal order issued to file them fully in the pending foreclosure suit to make the government a party thereto. This move is a stab at the Huntington scheme for a reorganization of the Union Pacific roads' indebtedness. The commission will be reported tomorrow by the House committee on Pacific roads, but the chances of passing Congress are remote. Foreclosure and the survival of the fittest is the program.

A Popular Revue.

RE. LOUIS, Jan. 19.—Chairman A. Russell of the late Populist party, received a letter from the Attorney General, on January 18, suspending him from membership in the national union, on account of alleged unbecoming conduct. This is one of the incidents of the national row between middle-class and business Populists, now in progress. The recent press sensation, an organization of Populist editors is split on the fusion question. The split over the late Mr. Van Hook without consulting Mr. Russell, ended the national conference for Memphis, Tennessee, February 22.

In the Case of Chaffey.
