Financial Conditions Less Disturbing -Mercantile Collections Are Irregular.

New York, Nov. 22 -- Dun's Week teview of Trade will say tomorrow; Improvement is reported in retail trade and sentiment more hopeful in ome commercial departments, but pending the resumption of active demand manufacturers will restrict pro duction. Financial conditions are less disturbing, much resulting from increaimports of gold, while a better feeling was caused by the announcement of further government ald, although the proposed bonds and certificates have not yet increased the actual supply of money. Mercantile collections are in-

regular, some sections of the country reporting unexpectedly prompt settlements, while at other points they are slow. The final returns for October indicated a favorable trade balance for the United States of \$68,747,482, and still better results are premised. No further difficulty is anticipated in meeting pay rolls, now that the mid-month settle-ments have been made without delay. Any pressure to force sales would result in concessions, but produ-cers maintain the statistical position by shutting down all capacity for which there is no demand. While actual can-cellations are few, many requests for deferred deliveries are reveived, and all departments of industry await more settled financial conditions. Iteduc-tion in blast furnace activity has checked the vigorous movement of ore, and it is probable that take shioments will not exceed 41,000,000 tons for the season. In an interview in which he was reviewing the speech he made here recently to representative steel and iron mee. Mr. Gary is unoted as saying: "Too many men have learned too late that the friendship of the public and the confidence of one's computitors are the most desirable elements in bind-ness.

The most desirable and the in our ness "I want to see how competitors suc-read. It is the policy of the side cor-paration not to crush compatition by fair or foul means. The steel trust cans-trobs about 60 per cent of the steel and iron business of the United States, and there is no intention of enlarging that control. We believe conditions will be better with healthy rivalry. "It is clear that the United States Steel corporation, with its extensive penources could use its giant strength. like other corporations to crush com-petition. But in the end would the game be worth the candle? The cor-paration would become an object of at-
