CORK, 19 .- At the Cork Assizes to-day, the outlaw leader, Connell, pleaded guilty to various charges against him. He will be a witness in other cases, in which members of his band are defendants. At the time of his arrest, in the latter part of December, for having arms in the proclaimed district, Concell was already suspected of being the leader of the band which had committed outrages, rendering the district of Mill Street one of the most notorious in Ireland. His arrest took place at Mushra under exciting circumstances. A large force of police, acting on private information, surrounded the house of Thos. Shea. a farmer living in a lonely district, near Mushra mountains.
