

MERRITT OCCUPIES MANILA

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Under a Demand for Surrender, Accompanied by a Threat to Bombard, the Spanish Commander Yielded.

Americans Entered the City Saturday Morning—Insurgents Took No Part—General Augusti Had Been Superseded—Spanish Officers Fared—City Administration Left in Spanish Hands.

The surrender of Manila on Saturday by Gen. Jankowski is officially announced.

The United States troops immediately occupied the city.

Washington, Aug. 16.—It is half past five this morning no advance had been made by the American troops.

The government knew on Saturday that Manila was captured on Sunday after the Japanese forces, whose army of 12,000 men, had been driven out of the city.

Manila apparently contained no more of the forces of the Japanese.
