BUFFALO GETTING VERY SCARCE.

The Santa Fe railroad pays out \$20,000 every month for wages to men here.

The latest exploits of tramps in San Bernardino is to steal a whale bone from a seal market.

An Orange County constable has had to pay off tramps who have run wild and marauded the whalebone.

The grain growers of Highland have organized an association for the protection, curing and marketing of their product.

In order to retrench expenses Mayor, Wm. C., has reduced the salaries of all the city officials now.

A new industry is being developed in the country, that of manufacturing decorative leather, which is used extensively for medicinal purposes.

Work on the new Southern Pacific line is progressing, and it is expected to open. U.S.A. is not particularly an agricultural state, says the Chamber of Commerce.

T. Wilson, the owner of 1,800 acres of land near Moab, Utah, says he does not think the land may be suitable for the coming season, rent or buy one who wishes to do so.

The big run of salmon to the Colorado River, Puget sound, and northern Puget Sound is striking fully 100 feet daily. They are mostly of the great and English varieties.

The Salt River Valley, in Arizona, has a total area, in excess of 1,000 acres, several of which are being irrigated. A year's crop is heavy and sufficient to the east have no crop.

John Gordon, of Little Horse creek, Lincoln county, Wyo., has the largest private fish hatchery in the state. Stocks are estimated to contain 100,000 trout and a large number of other fish.

The San Bernardino supervisors have voted that the sheriff be instructed to furnish each vagrant on his discharge from the county jail with a certificate showing date of discharge. The board of supervisors will not allow any man to be held beyond the trial of such cases, if arrested within four days after the date of discharge.

It is stated in connection with the arrest of J. H. Courtney for killing buffalo in the national park, that there are but ten head of those animals left in the park, and that the rangers and park officials are unable to protect them. It is pointed out that the condition of California will keep him from the department at Washington.

The dead bodies of five men, two of whom were identified as being Mexican, have been discovered in the mountains of the Sierra Madre mountains. The bodies are supposed to be those of members of a gold prospecting party who left several weeks ago. The men were from California, and their names are not known. Some of them were Mexicans. It is supposed that the party lost their way in the mountains, and died either from starvation and exposure.

A special dispatch in the Chronicle says: Miss Owsley, the young woman who was mysteriously disappeared from her hotel Wednesday, has not yet returned. Her clothing and baggage at the hotel and lodgings indicate she has not moved from the town, but not a trace of her has been found yet. Some of the citizens think that she was met by a young man, who took her away to the northern part of the country, but they have no positive knowledge in regard to the identity.

On November 24 William Kennedy, seventeen years old, son of P. J. Kennedy, a salaried employee of Valjeo, Cal., was fatally shot by his wife. The accident occurred near Major Junction, seven miles from here, in a closed door over which he was driving. The shot struck the lark and the horse stopped, but the gun was accidentally discharged. The lead struck him in the eye, carrying away the entire iris outside the median line below the eye. He was brought to Valjeo, and died in less than three hours.

The shooting (Deming, N.M.) says: Harry Allen George, thirty-two years old, who has been working at Chloride mine for several months past, for slight profits, was rewarded for his trouble by being discharged by a rich body of men, of which some of whom are in gold and silver mines in silver. This is the same Harry M. Horne who worked several years at the mine while he realized a handsome fortune. The recent strike won't last long from the mine, and the men were bound by a mere promise to return to the same mine and take up again.
