

majority in the Assembly, but it is said that he has failed, and that the Duke de Cazes has since been entrusted with the task.

The Assembly, to-day, adopted a motion offered by Willowisky, reducing the annual redemption payments by ten millions of dollars, thus aggravating ministerial defeats. It also confirmed the decision to discuss Vintaron's constitutional report from the committee of thirty on Monday. It is expected that the new ministers will demand a postponement of this debate. If it is postponed the whole Left and the Bonapartists will vote for the dissolution of the Assembly.

It is said that the Transatlantic Steamship Company will appeal the award of the British Admiralty court in the case of the abandoned steamer *America*.

The Chevalier Nigra, the Italian Minister to France, was at a fete given in Avignon, in honor of Petrarch, and in a speech declared that Italy would be eternally grateful to France, and he rejoiced in being able to give assurances of the cordial friendship of the two countries.

The crisis at Versailles continues. The Duke de Broglie has failed to form a cabinet because the legitimists are determined in their opposition to the prolongation of MacMahon's power.

BERLIN, 19.—The government has increased the stringency of the regulations restricting ultramontaine agitation, and the clubs and the clerical press will be closely watched and vigorously dealt with for disloyal or illegal manifestations.

BAYONNE, 19.—Cuenca surrendered to the Carlists on the 16th.

MADRID, 19.—A decree has been issued declaring all Spain in a state of Siege, sequestrating the property of Carlists, whose estates will be held liable to a heavy penalty to the relatives of republicans slain, and also creating a special reserve of one hundred and twenty-five thousand men. The government announces in its official orders, that it will not permit the shooting of prisoners in retaliation for Carlist atrocities.

LONDON, 20, 5.30 a.m.—In a colliery explosion at Wigan, fifteen persons were killed.

A Calcutta dispatch says that the rivers from Assam to Oude have flooded the country, causing much damage.

PARIS, 20.—In the Assembly, to-day, General De Cisse, minister of war and vice president of the council, announced that Baron de Chabaud La Tour had been appointed minister of the interior, and M. Mathieu Bodet minister of finance; he further stated that the cabinet, as now organized, had not had sufficient time to agree upon its policy, and moved a postponement of the constitutional debate until Thursday. Agreed to.

The new ministerial appointments are considered a blow to the Bonapartists, who are now without a representative in the cabinet. In the Assembly, next Thursday, Changarnier will move a further postponement of the debate on constitutional bills until January '75. On this question the ministry will be neutral. The Left will oppose the motion.

Napoleon Lannes, Duke of Montebello, is dead, aged 73.

Jules Favre has married an Alsatian refugee.

HAVANA, 20.—Captain General Concha has issued a decree, to take effect August 1st, providing that duties be paid as follows: 50 per cent in specie, 25 per cent in Spanish bank bills, with 100 per cent added, the remaining 25 per cent in bank bills at their nominal value. On and after the 1st proximo land taxes are to be paid in bank bills, with the addition of 100 per cent. The decree of June 4th, authorizing the Spanish Bank to sell specie on account of the treasury, to be used in payment of duties, is annulled.

MADRID, 20.—A proclamation has been issued supplementary to the decree establishing a state of siege; it declares that charges of sedition or conspiracy against the state shall be tried by court martial, and that persons convicted of interfering with the operation of railways or telegraphs shall suffer death.

LONDON, 20.—Marshal Jewell, the American minister to St. Petersburg, left that city yesterday, on his return to the U. S., to assume the duties of postmaster general.

BERLIN, 20.—The police, in accordance with a telegram from Kissingen, have searched the

house of M. Cremen, editor of the *Germania*, and other prominent ultramontanes, and have seized a number of documents.

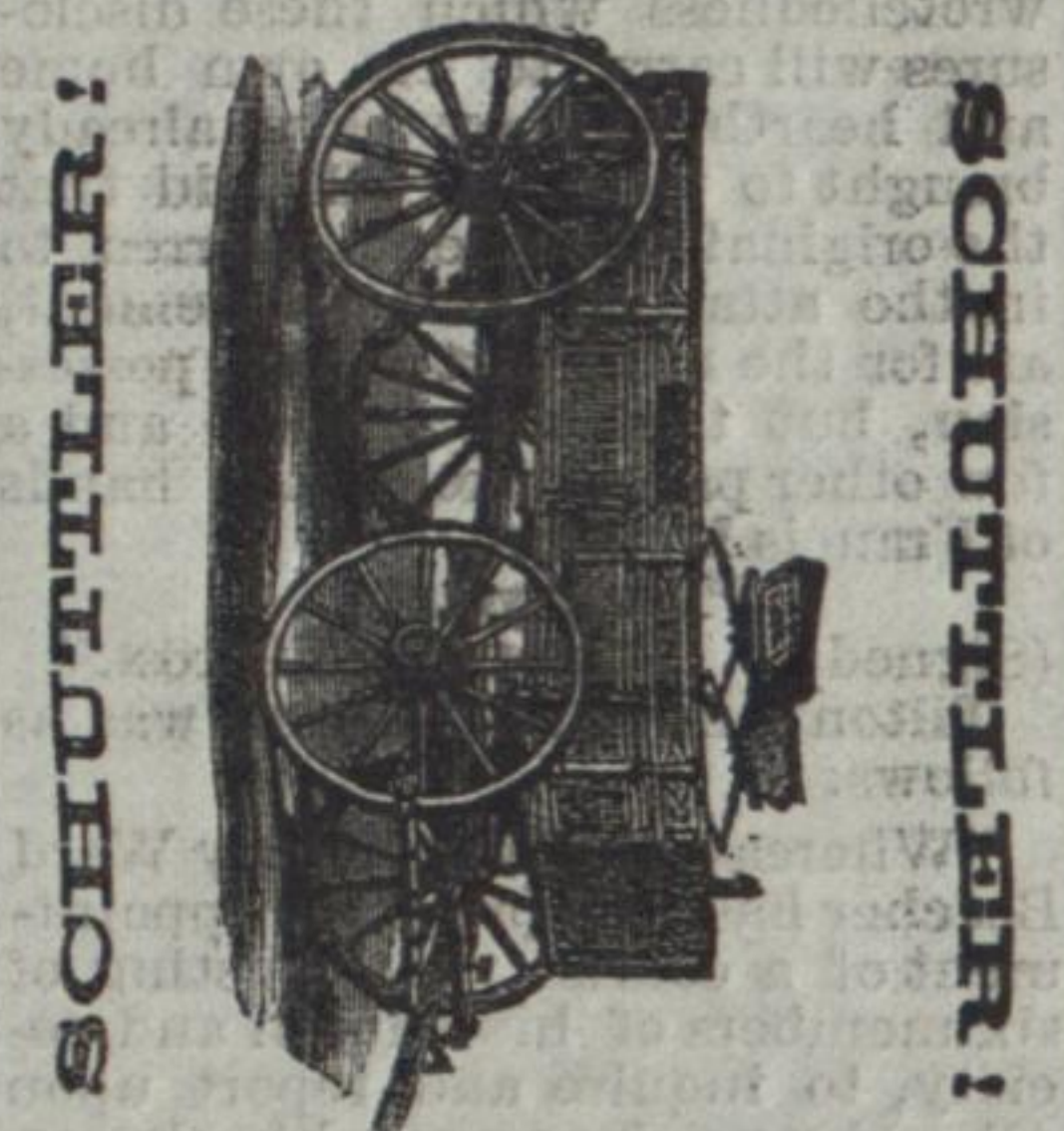
