The evidence went to show that Kemp did not drink to excess, but when intoxicated he would use the house and furniture belonging to his wife, and even threatened her life. Mrs. Kemp was given title to a city lot in lieu of alimony. The couple were married June 17, 1867, in Hereford, England.

## DOGS ENTANGLE OWNERS IN FIGHT

Hair Pulling Match on West Temple Follows Conflict of Bull-dog With Newfoundland.

## FOUR WOMEN MIX MATTERS

One of Them, Sixty Years of Age, Suffers the Loss of Much Hair and Is Badly Scratched.

A row which started Monday evening in a battle between a bulldog owned by Mrs. Charles Russell of 1415 south West Temple, and a Newfoundland owned by Percy Hallen of 1420 south West Temple, and ended in a hair pulling match with four women and two men entered in the lists, is soon to be aired in court.

The warrants in the case were issued yesterday and served today. They are against Mrs. Russell and her mother Mrs. Conzo J. Brewer, a woman 60 years old, who was the owner of the Newfoundland. The women seriously hurt in the fracas. The warrants were sworn out at the instance of Mrs. Leona Lewis, who entered the field of battle rather late in its progress, much to her own disaster.

Just what the details are, no one will fully know until all sides have a chance to give their versions in court. According to some witnesses, the transfer of the center of interest from the dogs to the people involved started when Percy Hallen used a horrid oath in addressing Mrs. Russell, to which she replied by dashing in his face a bucket of milk that she happened to have with her.

**FRACAS STARTS.**

This action was followed by Mrs. Hallen's flying into Mrs. Russell's hair, and Mrs. Russell's being attacked by Mrs. Lewis, a friend of the Hallens, while trying to disengage herself from Mrs. Hallen. Into the fracas entered Charles Russell, husband of Mrs. Russell, and ditto Mr. Hallen, who engaged Russell. Then came the aged daughter to be set upon by Mrs. Lewis, a young and strong woman, who threw the old lady to the ground, ripped out great banks of her gray hair, and scratched gouges through her face. Both Mrs. Russell and Mrs. Hallen rushed to pull off Mrs. Lewis, forgetting their own differences in their desire to protect the aged woman. Mrs. Lewis then turned her attention to Mrs. Russell, the latter succeeding in landing an upper-cut which put her safely out for the full count and ended the battle. Mrs. Hallen and Mr. Russell had had a side line of difficulties ending in apologies after a wrestling match, and a handshake, after which Mr. Russell held a dinner of water for Mrs. Hallen to wash off the dust of combat.

Mrs. Russell in describing how things were started declared that she was crossing the street with a small bucket of milk secured from a neighbor when Hallen passed in a buggy, and commenced sticking his dog on her bulldog, which was with her. The dogs grappled, but Mrs. Russell secured her dog by collar, and was pulling him in a way when Hallen struck his on, and it set a hold on the hind legs of the Russell dog. This seemed hardly according to the rules of the game, and Mrs. Russell released her dog. Mean-while Hallen urged that Mrs. Russell let them fight it out, stating that a finish fight would settle the matter of supremacy and establish who was boss.

When the dogs went to it, each one's owner "sticking" him on until the Hallen dog turned tail and ran for the house, there to find a warm champion in Mrs. Hallen, whose wrath was vented in remarks addressed to Mrs. Russell. These were joined in by Mr. Hallen, who, when he saw his dog was a provoker of the quarrel, with a vile oath addressed to Mrs. Russell's that he would be the last to speak up for her.
