A Berlin dispatch says: The Czar will inform the nobility of Moscow at a reception to-day of his determination to call a number of unofficial advisers to assist him in the government of the empire. The council will be purely deliberative, without any right of control or interference, and will be chosen partly by the suffrages of the middle and peasant classes, and partly by direct nomination by the Czar from the ranks of the heriditary nobility. 
