any person, by persuasion or otherwise, to attempt to mislead or influence others in the commission of the crime of bigamy or polygamy.

2. Be it further enacted that any person or persons who shall be guilty of the violation of this act shall on conviction be punished by confinement at labor in the penitentiary for any time not less than two nor longer than four years.
