## CITIZENS FAVOR BONDS FOR SEWER.

Only 301 Votes Cast—252 for Bonds, 49 Against.

## TAX VALUATION \$500,000.

Suit Compromised—Divorce Suits—Wedding of Three Couples—News Told in Brief.

The bond election which was held yesterday carried by a vote of 252 for the bonding and 49 against it. The voting was extremely light, little interest being exhibited in the affair, the majority of the taxpayers forgetting that there was an election going on. The vote in wards was as follows:

Bonds to the amount of \$50,000 will now be issued at a low rate of interest. There will be ten series, one series coming due each year, thus each year the interest will be reduced. With the new sewer district laid out and completed, Ogden will have a sewerage system covering the greater part of the business and residence parts of the city from Monroe avenue on the east to Twentieth street on the north to Twenty-eighth street on the south. The result of the election will be reported to the council next Monday evening, when definite steps will be taken looking to the installation of the sewer in district No. 5.

## FIRST TAX NOTICES.

County Treasurer A. D. Chambers expects tomorrow to have the greater part of the first tax notices ready for mailing, about 10,000 in all. During the past week, he has had a large corps of assistants busy copying the notices, which work until 1 o'clock p. m. each morning. Another shift comes on and work until midnight, and then the third shift comes on and works until 8 in the morning. The valuation in Ogden City and Weber county this year will be about half a million dollars. Besides a large increase in assessment valuations, the county has also received a large number of assessments on the Union Pacific property, the street railway and other large corporations under the recent ruling of the supreme court, the delinquent figures of the assessments are not yet ready to be given out, but will be a great increase over last year.

## SUIT COMPROMISED FOR \$275.

The suit brought by L. L. Richard against the Southern Pacific company was compromised for \$275 by stipulation. The action was brought by stipulation to recover \$1,335 from defendant, alleged to be due on account of the carelessness in transporting the horses from Winnemucca, Nev., to Ogden, Utah, where last over the Union Pacific to St. Louis, Mo. The property has been disposed of and it is thought that she was given half the money and custody of the children.

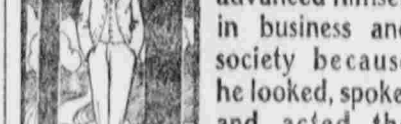
