SUFFERING OF SOLDIERS IN
THE SUDAN.

Terrible Mortality of the Troops in

the Sudan.

LONDON, April 4.—Gen. Wolseley

has forwarded to the War Office a sig-

nificant report made out by the medical

staff attached to the Khartoum expedi-

tion. The subject of the report is the

result of exposure to desert heat of the

British troops stationed along the bor-

ders of the Sudan desert. The report

states that if the present military sit-

uation continues, the health of the

troops will be ruined. The whole tone of

the report, which was undoubtedly

inspired by General Wolseley him-

self, indicates that a decision having

been reached to that effect, the public

will be prepared to receive the news of

the withdrawal of the whole British force

from the Sudan to Egypt, and the

complete abandonment of the Khartoum

expedition. It is announced that

Gen. Graham has been ordered by the

Government to open peace

negotiations with Osman Digna, or the

Sheikhs between Suakin and Berber,

possessing power to control the na-

tives. It has been stated that Gen.

Graham has been instructed to secure

such terms as will enable him to

evacuate the country at once.

In pursuance of these particular

instructions, Gen. Graham to-day

withdrew his whole force back

from Tamai to Suakin, leaving

only a small contingent at

General McNellie's camp. It is be-

lieved that no operations will be un-

dertaken against the Tamians. The
