She died in full faith of a glorious resurrection, firm in the principles of the Everlasting Gospel, leaving a faithful record of honor, integrity and usefulness.

**SHORT.**—At the residence of her son, Samuel Short, at Glenwood, Sevier County, Jan. 20, 1884, of general debility, Elizabeth Short, born August 8th, 1807, in London, England.
