## **Sudden Death.**

**About 9 o'clock** last evening, Brother Benjamin Salisbury, a well-known resident of the Fourteenth Ward, left his home to carry some parcels to East Temple Street, saying to his wife that he would return in a few minutes. In front of Market Street, First South Street, he was struck by a horse and wagon, and he was killed. The cause of death was congestion of the lungs. Deceased was an old citizen of Salt Lake, and had many friends and acquaintances.

**Death of T. O. Angell, Sr.**  
 Yesterday, shortly before noon, Elder Truman Angell, Sr., Church architect, died at his residence in the Third Ward, this city, at the advanced age of 77 years, 4 months and 11 days. Deceased was an old veteran in the Church, and the Temple now in process of completion in this city will serve to perpetuate his memory, he having been the architect of it. He was a modest, unassuming man, of genial disposition, and was a staunch and true Latter-day Saint. For some years he was afflicted with dropsy, which disease, aggravated by a severe cold he recently contracted, is the supposed cause of death. It is the purpose of the family to have prepared for publication, a sketch of his life, which will be read with interest among the host of his friends and acquaintances who respected him for his sterling worth.

## **THE CHURCH SUITS.**

**The Legal Battle Over Church Property Commenced.**

**To-day, October 17,** was the date set for the hearing of the arguments in the suits of the United States vs. the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints and the Perpetual Emigrating Fund Company, in the Supreme Court of the Territory of Utah.

**The plaintiff** is represented by District Attorney Geo. S. Peters and his assistants, Wm. J. Clarke, of Utah, and Henry W. Hobson, United States Attorney for Colorado. The attorneys for the defense are Col. James O. Broadhead, of Missouri, Senator Joseph H. McDonald, of Indiana, and Hens. F. S. Richards and Le Grand Young, of this city.

**The only one** of the gentlemen named as the defendants, in connection with the organizations against whom the suits are brought, who was present in court, was Col. John R. Winder. Among those present as witnesses were James Jack, Esq., and Recorder Geo. M. Cannon, of Salt Lake County, who had brought along with him several volumes of the county records.

**When the** subject was brought up before the court, Mr. McDonald, for the defense asked leave to withdraw the answer already filed in the case, and the demurrer formerly submitted, and to file a new demurrer. In connection with this he desired a postponement of the case for one day.

**Mr. Peters** made no opposition to the requests, which were granted. The new demurrer filed is as follows:
