SCHOOLS IN GOOD SHAPE.

Have an Enrollment of Nearly Fourteen Thousand Pupils.

The report of the city schools for the month of November shows a total enrollment of 13,939 pupils, of which 39 are colored children. During the month there were 1,195 cases of tardiness and 44 cases of truancy. The average rate of attendance in all the schools was 94.4 per cent and the average punctual-ity was 99.7 per cent. The largest en-rollment was in the Grant school, which had 1.022 pupils. The smallest was the Jordan which had an enroll-ment of 59 children. ment of 59 children.
