The mechanic visited St. Petersburg, and soon after moved his whole establishment there. He had Imperial orders for as many locomotive engines as he could construct. He has lately returned to his own country, and is still receiving large returns from his Russian workshop. And all this prosperity grew out of his unselfish civility to two strangers, one of whom was the secret agent of the Czar of Russia.

-The President of the Republic of Liberia, Daniel Bashiell Warner, is of unmixed African blood. He is an able statesman, an eloquent speaker and a graceful writer. He is the third President of the young Republic, which is now seventeen years old.

-A large and singular meteor fell in Hubbardstown, Massachusetts, during the night of Sept. 9th. On visiting the spot the next morning, a mass was found of a galatinous, light colored, semi-transparent substance, described by some parties to be as large as a hogshead. A gentleman who visited the spot three days afterwards, after a large quantity had been carried away, and much more trampled into the earth, and dissolved or evaporated, says that he could at that time have gathered two bushels of the debris. The latter had a strong odor of sulphurated hydrogen with a sulphurous taste.-[N. Y. Dispatch.

-The village of Chapel Hill, in Lafayette county, Mo., was almost totally destroyed by fire on the 10th instant. The buildings were set on fire by four armed men, supposed to be bushwhackers, and twenty houses consumed. Subsequently, the only remaining storehouse, together with the residence of Mrs. Cobb, was burned. At the commencement of the war, Chapel Hill was a beautiful and thriving village, and contained one of the finest institutions of learning in the State. The college buildings, the church, and nearly every house is in ruins, and the inhabitants scattered over every part of the country.

-Starchy food for infants, such as arrow-root, sago, tapioca, corn-starch, etc., is commonly held to be not only very digestible, but highly nutritious; and yet it is a common experience with medical men to find children so fed to be feeble, sickly, and poorly nourished. Professor Rollestod, of Oxford, has shown the reason of this, and, in an interesting paper recently read by him before the British Association, he has demonstrated, by the record of a series of experiments, that the digestive organs of infants are powerless to convert and digest starch in any degree whatever. The practical value of this important discovery is immense. Children are daily being starved to death, while apparently abundantly fed, through ignorance of this fact; the only real nourishment received by them being the sugar, milk, eggs, etc., which are combined with their arrow-root diet .- Boston Courier.

-Digitaline, discovered in 1830 by Le Royer in the digitalis purpurea or foxglove, is a plant possessing an electric action on the pulsations of the heart, the vital functions of which it can stop entirely, thereby occasioning death. It is prescribed in very small doses for palpitation of the heart, but even then it must be used with caution, because it accumulates in the system, and the practitioner may sometimes be surprised at the sudden death of his patient even some time after he has left off the use of it.

-Among the emigrants who arrived were about 100 factory girls, whose passage had been paid by the Lawrence mill companies. The girls were sent forward to Lawrence, Mass., at once.

-Ashes thrown carelessly from a tobacco pipe occasioned a conflagration a week or two ago, which swept four thousand acres of Long Island land bare of everything like life and property.

-Governor Morton has issued an earnest appeal to the County Commissioners of Indiana to provide for the relief of the families of the men drafted in that State.

-A manufacturer in Pittsfield, Mass., who wanted to build a house this season, but had not time to attend to it, gave the superintendence of the job to his wife, who has built a twenty thousand dollar mansion, which is now nearly ready for occupancy.

-The California telegraph line is completed to Scattle, Washington Territory.

-Patent leather belts are used in England for out door work. They are said to be impervious to damp and retain their length in all weather.

-Nearly all the cotton factories in Woonsocket are stopped for want of cotton. There are twenty cotton mills in the town. The woolen mills are in full blast.

-Israel Washburne has recently presented to the town of Washburne, Aroostook county, Maine, a valuable library.

-A treaty has been concluded between France and Cochin-China, which authorizes the formation of a French protectorate in several provinces of Lower Cochin-China, and gives to the French great commercial privileges.

-Mr. S. D. Case, of Canton Centre, Connecticut, finds that by grafting his chestnut trees the nuts are not only larger, but ripen earlier.

—The number of arrests by the police of Hartford, Conn., for the quarter ending with the 1st instant, was 608, of which 227 were for drunkenness. The Hartford papers think crime is on the increase.
