Made Prominent.

## FARIBAUT SYSTEM PLANS.

Federal Party Says Use of School  
Houses for Religious Purposes is  
Contrary to U. S. Constitution.

Manila, July 12.—The first public discussion of the bill to establish a department of public instruction developed a contest on the question of religious instruction in public schools. Interest centers in the section permitting priests and ministers to teach religion for half an hour three times weekly outside of school hours, desired for such instruction, and prohibiting teachers from conducting religious exercises or the teaching of religion. The directors of the Federal party were represented by a committee who, although Catholics, argued strongly in favor of the elimination of the section. They declared that the use of the school houses for religious purposes is contrary to the United States Constitution, and also to the platforms of the American parties and the Philippine Federal party, and is certain to cause discord.

Judge Taft said the attitude of a U. S. Philippine commission as a legislative power was one of absolute intolerance of religious instruction. Protestant difference between Catholics, The anti-Mohammedan religion. The commissioners, he added, endeavored to frame the act so that the people's prejudices would assist instead of retard its success.

## Imlay Clark Estate Claimant.

New York, Jan. 12.—Another claimant for the \$20,000 estate left by Imlay Clark, the gold mine owner who died in Australia about two years ago, has put in an appearance in the person of Edward Hilliker of Parachute, Colo., who has written to Governor Voorhees of New Jersey, setting forth his claims and asking information. The governor has turned over the case of the new claimant to Elvin W. Crane of Newark, N. J., counsel for three claimants, Mrs. W. H. Delaney, George M. Love and Annie Alvord of New York.

Attachment Suit Against Tewksbury  
New York, Jan. 12.—Frederick Tetlow of Philadelphia, N. J., has begun an attachment suit for \$10,000 against Lewis G. Tewksbury, the ascending broker, who is now in Mexico. The suit is brought to recover money loaned to Tewksbury and the defendant is taken against certain property in Union county, in which it is claimed Tewksbury holds an interest.

CHINESE AND JAPANESE NOTE.  
State Department Doubts if Plenipotentiaries Have Signed it.

New York, Jan. 12.—A special to the Times from Washington says: Not much faith is placed by the state department in the story from Paris that the joint note has been signed by Prince Chang and Li Hung Chang. It is said that Minister Conger would certainly have reported an event of so much importance, and that not a word from him has been received on the subject.

The state department is still strongly inclined to doubt whether the opposition of the empress dowager can be overcome by any ordinary means. The appearance of Chang Chi Tung as leader of the opposition increases that doubt. Chang is known throughout China as the principle representative of whatever patriotism and love of country is left in the empire. His influence is the greater because his antipathy to foreigners has never led him into any of the useless and violent moves against them such as the Boxer rebellion. Chang has always sought by conservative means to build up the patriotic spirit in his country without compromising it in the hands of fanatics. He is additionally respected because he is known to be an incorruptible officer holder, a rarity in China, and he has actually sunk a fortune in public works without getting a cent dishonestly.

The fact that such a man has wanted the empress dowager that she must authorize him to the plenipotentiaries is of great significance. If the empress dowager should again assent to the signing of the note, she would have to reckon with a patriotic movement led by Chang.

CLOSE UNION OF RITUALISTS.  
Such the Probable Result of the Duke of Newcastle's Visit.

New York, Jan. 12.—The duke of Newcastle, who has been in this country for some weeks, has been one of the noted participants in several conferences held during the week with high church leaders among the Protestant Episcopalians of New York and Philadelphia. As a result of these conferences, it is learned that a definite plan has been formed to bring into close union the ritualists of England and the United States. The first efforts toward this union are to be made in New York, Philadelphia and Boston. It is the plan to extend the effort later on to other parts of the United States. To foster this union it is stated is the chief object of the present visit to the United States. It is being assisted in his efforts by two London churchmen, A. Clifton Kelway of the Church Review, and Harry Wilson, vicar of St. Augustine's church.

RELATIONS WITH VENEZUELA.  
United States Remonstrates Against Action in Asphalt Matter.

Washington, Jan. 11.—The status of the Venezuelan controversy has not been improved by the latest negotiations between the United States and Venezuela, and this government has remonstrated against the seeming determination of the Venezuelan authorities to take executive cognizance of the asphalt right, instead of leaving it to the decision of the judicial branch. The desire of this government from left to the court, and it has sought to impress this view upon the Venezuelan government. He asked whether it was not foolish to take action which would unnecessarily shock the feelings of the Catholic people.

TO NEW HOME.L. D. S. Business College Opens  
Monday in New Apartments.

## IT IS A GREAT CHANGE.

Social Hall and Lion House Continue  
In Use—Night School in New Quarters—Other Meetings.

The Latter-day Saints' business college was transferred today to the new home, east of the Temple, on Main street, and now occupies every room of the new building. On Monday the business college will therefore open in these roomy, new apartments, and will hereafter be conducted entirely therein.

The change in location from the old Social hall to the new temple of learning, is like a sudden transformation; for the old quarters were very ordinary, while the new ones are extraordinary. No other business college in this western country occupies an entire building, or is fitted out with such equipments, rooms, and facilities as this institution. It is learned, however, that the Social hall is not abandoned by the college, but is now to be used as a gymnasium for the students of both sexes. Mrs. Freda B. Cluff, instructor in physical culture is proceeding to organize regular classes in physical training, each session of which will meet two afternoons every week for general athletic exercises on the upper floor of the Social hall.

It is learned also that the high school and normal departments will continue to occupy the Lion house, as it would not be possible to put the 500 students of all departments into any one of the three buildings now occupied. The college will thus occupy, for the rest of the present school year, the new business college building, the Lion house, and the Social hall. The large three-story, brick granary located near the new college building, is also partly used by the college as a boiler house, and for toilet rooms. This building will be entirely vacated next summer as the presiding Bishop's store room, and will then be fitted up into chemical and biological laboratories by the college board.

The college night school, which has hitherto been very inadequately provided for in certain rooms of the Lion house, will be opened Monday night in the new building, and will be characterized by four improvements:—It will be well-lighted, well-warmed and ventilated, and will have every convenience of thorough equipment and plenty of room. Ten teachers have been given classes in the night school. It is likely that the college assembly room will be used for various public meetings, for which the Assembly hall is a little too large, and any of the ward houses too small or too far from the college. Altogether, the new college building, used day and night, winter and summer, by the school and by other public organizations, promises to be one of the most useful buildings ever erected here.

## CURTAILS LIBERTY.

Correspondent on Vaccination vs  
Boards of Health and Education.

Morgan City, Jan. 10.—This question of vaccination I have followed very closely for about one year and a half, and have to call the attention of the public including the board of health and the medical fraternity, to a phase of the question I have not yet seen brought out.

The compulsory vaccination that the board of health advocates deprives the parents of healthy unvaccinated children of their liberty to elect for themselves whether their children shall be vaccinated or not. We have no law on our statute books that makes it compulsory, neither is there any law of Congress that compels such a procedure. Under the school law all children are eligible to the benefits of education at all times unless suffering from some contagious disease, and to exclude those that are not is an infraction of the law, and the board of trustees so doing is liable to a suit for damages before the law.

If the edict of the board of health is tenable, should they not also require all children under school age to be vaccinated also all over and the unvaccinated parents? I take the position that it would be far better if the board of health would demand the thorough cleaning up of all the effete and decaying matter that accumulates around restaurants, saloons and kindred places in Salt Lake City, and if doctors would use the simple remedy I mean 1 gr. sugar lead, 1 gr. fox glove (digitalis) 1/2 tea spoonful of sugar dissolved in 1 tea spoonful of water, to which should be added 4 ounces of water. 1 teaspoonful to be administered every hour the contagion would soon be stamped out.

This remedy has been used in hospitals where there have been from 50 to 100 cases—a time with perfect success. I suppose there is not money enough for the doctor in such cases.

## DANGER OF VACCINATION.

The smallpox is not so much to be dreaded in a community as the bad effects of vaccination, which fills the blood with poisons more to be dreaded, and which in many cases, produces death or entails syphilis, consumption, eczema, tuberculosis, etc., which causes suffering and a bill as long as these diseases are transmitted to future generations.

FRED AUERBACH ESTATE.  
Executors Petition for Permission to Sell Part of Same.

The executors of the will of F. H. Auerbach, deceased, have petitioned the district court for an order authorizing them to sell the one-half interest of deceased in the dry goods business of Auerbach & Bro., to the highest bidder, for cash. The hearing on the petition has been set for Jan. 22d, and Spencer Clawson and Arthur Parsons, with another party, have been designated to appraise the estate's half interest in the goods now in the store, together with the fixtures and good will of the business. According to the petition just filed, about \$228,000 does not include more than \$160,000 worth of real property, has come into the hands of the executors. The estate cannot be closed until its interest in the dry goods firm is disposed of. More than \$200,000 of the bequests, according to the statement of the executor, has been paid, and about \$20,000 is necessary to the final winding up of the estate.
